Minutes

The Minutes of the last Meeting were read & confirmed.

Followings Mr. Leslie said that steps were being taken to apply. Rd claim this F/P

Pond The Clerk of R.D.C. requested that the P.C. should make provision for the levy of a 1^d rate towards beautifying the pond, when submitting their estimates for the next financial year 1959/60

at The Surveyor, in a letter, offered to fix the seats when ready.

Pond Mr. Leslie said that the exact location for the seats at the Pond had been settled.

The Clerk was instructed to ask the District Surveyor whether work on the Pond could be continued this year, in view of the £30.5.0 received in gifts recently. The fund was now £80.5.0 (Proposed Mr. Leslie, sec. Mrs. Smith)

John's The Clerk was asked to draw the attention Manor House of the Highways Authority to the condition of this F/P, at the manor house end.

The Clerk of R.D.C. said in a letter that he Field Rd. was looking into the matter. Mr. Leslie thought that the heat had changed hands

recently. It was agreed to await the outcome of the R.D.C's enquiry into the matter.

Telephone

The Clerk said that she had received notification from the Sales Superintendent of P.O. Telephones that the P.C.'s phone would have to share a line with 1, Southview, Old Lane. The rental would, accordingly, be reduced by 40/- a year.

Definitive Map.

The Definitive Map was examined, & it was agreed that it should be given to the F/P Committee before being made available to the public.

Council Houses

Mr. Smith said that there were still people in the village who would like to have a Council House, and asked whether R.D.C. could be asked whether they had any plans for the immediate future. It was agreed that the Clerk should seek information on this subject.

Land at back of Bakery

Mr. Smith, referring to a piece of land at the back of the Bakery, asked whether any action can be taken by a R.D.C. or P.C. on the use of land as dump for scrap cars. The Clerk was asked to seek guidance on the matter from the Clerk R.D.C.

The Minutes of the last Meeting were read & confirmed

Huts in
Field Rd

The Clerk read a letter from R.D.C. saying that these huts
were, in 1956, the subject of a refusal of planning permission
for use as week-end occupation. An appeal was
allowed permitting their retention for storage purposes,
also occupation, although not for sleeping. Several
inspections of the site had been made, but the huts
had been found vacant. It would be difficult to
substantiate grounds for carrying out enforcement
action, unless more definite evidence of unauthorized
use were forthcoming. The Clerk was instructed
to write R.D.C. informing them that the huts had
recently changed hands, and asking whether the new
tenants were aware of the restrictions.

Pond

A letter from the Surveyor was read saying that at a
recent Committee meeting an alternative suggestion
was made that, instead of the provision of rockery
stone on the banks, gravel should be laid ramped
down below the water line. It was thought that
this gravel would provide hard standing for
children paddling, & a little colour. The matter
was discussed. Mr. Leslie thought it would be a
pity to lose the rockery. There would have to be

maintenance on any turf that would have to be substituted for the rockery. He did not wish for any official encouragement of paddling in the pond.

It was agreed that Mr. Hodson should find out how R.D.C. intended to make the rockery, as there was no evidence of slopes in the original plan. Mr. Hodson said that he had been assured by the Surveyor that there would not be any appreciable difference in the overflow of the Pond.

F/P Manors

House The Clerk said that this F/P had been attended to.

New Council Houses R.D.C. in a letter said that it was proposed to build 10 houses on their site in Tynesfield Road, subject to the approval of the Ministry, this work would be included in their programme for 1959.

Land at back

of The Ballingay The R.D.C. in a letter said that they might be empowered to deal with this matter, which might possibly be a contravention under Town Planning, with further details, they were prepared to look into the matter. It was agreed that Mr. Jeary should speak to the occupier.

Allots Rent

The Clerk said there was one outstanding rent for Allotments, & she hoped to collect this soon. The Allotments Committee made arrangements to inspect the Allotments.

School Transport

A complaint was received about the inadequate transport in the evening for children at Wardings & Whyleafe Schools. The second bus had not been restored after the bus strike, and the number

going to the Schools had increased. The Clerk was instructed to write to L.T.E. ~~L.P.F.B.~~ on the matter, & send a copy of the letter to the Purley Education Officer.

A further complaint about the condition of Old Lane was discussed. The Clerk was asked to write again to R.D.C. & draw their attention to this matter, & to a hole in Crossways Road.

Minutes The Minutes of the last Meeting were read, & confirmed.

Huts in Goultfield Road Mrs. Leslie said there was definite occupation of these huts in Goultfield Road at weekends. The Clerk was instructed to ask R.D.C. to notify the new owners of the vets concerning occupation of these huts.

The Pond The Chairman said that Mr. Hodgson had obtained the necessary information, and, so as to be in time for the Committee Meeting, had asked the Clerk to write to the Engineers' Surveyors, saying that if rocks were used, it would be preferable to have these close together & laid in concrete. Also that the Parish Council thought that if the slopes were the same all the way round, the general appearance would be hard, therefore it was suggested a small slope in gravel, & the remaining area in grass, or built sheer, would be preferable. The Clerk said that, in answer to this letter, she had received a dictated letter over the phone agreeing with these proposals, & promising that when work was being carried out, Mr. Hodgson would be consulted again, so that work could be carried out in the manner the P.C. suggested.

~~and behind~~ Mr. Geary said that he had spoken to the occupier who had told him that he had no intention of using the land in question as a car dump. Members of the Council noted the fact that there had not been any cars on the land recently.

The Allotments Committee reported that the allotments were dirty. Mr. Geary proposed, secy by Mr. Smith, that the Tenants have their attention drawn to Clauses (e) & (f) of their agreements.

that it waited some minutes at Tatsfield before

leaving again, in the afternoon, so that no running

time would be affected.

The Clerk read a letter from the R.D.C. Clerk saying that negotiations for the land had been difficult & protracted. It was hoped that a longer lease than had been offered by the owner would shortly be negotiated, whereupon no time would be lost in putting in hand the necessary work.

Business

The Engineer said that he was taking up the matter

Pond

The Chairman said that he had been given to understand that work would start again soon on this project.

Village Sign

The Surveyor, in a letter, said that the Village sign had been taken down. It would be repaired, & a sheet of perspex placed over it for protection.

London Transport

The Clerk read a letter from London Transport Executive saying that it was regretted that an extra journey for schoolchildren could not be provided, unless the Education Authority be prepared to guarantee the cost of their doing so. It was recognised that a limited number of intending passengers might not be able to find room, but they had to make economies in their services because of a substantial decline in the level of traffic generally. A letter from the Turley Divisional Education Officer repeated the above but added that the reply would be reported to the Executive at a meeting on 5th Dec. when consideration might be given to the hiring of a

coach to convey the majority of the Tatsfield children, especially the younger ones.

Playing Fields Mr. Hodgson said that, apart from legal formalities, the matter of Playing Fields was practically settled.

Cats' eyes The Clerk reported that these had been laid up Croydon Rd to the Kent boundary
