

Regarding this, a letter was read from the Clerk of the R.D.C. stating that, though it appeared possible for a P. Council to incur reasonable expenditure in the maintenance, repair and protection of such a Memorial in their district, the R.D.C. Clerk could find nothing to authorize a Parish Council to erect or contribute to the cost of erecting such a Memorial. The Clerk then stated, that if the P. Council wished to proceed with the proposal, the sanction of the Minister under the proviso to Section 228(1) of the Local Govt. Act 1933, must be obtained.

The Clerk was instructed to write asking for this sanction.

A seeming discrepancy in the current Telephone A/c submitted for payment was noticed, and on the proposal by Mr Knight sec. by Dr Smith, the Clerk was instructed to enquire into the matter.



Fatl. Savings The Clerk was instructed to post notices asking for volunteer Group Collectors.

Civil Defense. No member was able to promise attendance at the R.D.C. meeting on Nov. 9th.

Memorial Brans. A letter from the Ministry of Housing and Local Govt. gave the possibility of a sanction for the subscription of not more than £6 to make up any deficit in the amount necessary for completion of the Memorial.

Case of old people. A letter from the R.D.C. was read giving particulars of a report of a Conference held recently by the Council for Health Education, regarding the well-being of elderly people especially those living alone.

Mrs Hodgson explained the working of various organisations in the village dealing with this matter. The Not so Young Club, Women's Institute, and District Nurse. She stressed the difficulty of dealing with those people who objected strongly to anyone entering their homes. Mrs Hodgson and Mrs Dottie promised to obtain a list of all old people in the district, and assurances were given that the matter should be explored further by the Committee of the Not so Young Club.

The Clerk was instructed to write to the C. Mr Smith suggested that the County Surveyor be informed that if the shrubs promised were provided the Headmaster of the School and his pupils were prepared to plant some.

It was reported that obstruction of Greenways was caused by the bad parking of cars, vans and lorries outside the dwelling of a Mrs Cooper. The Clerk was instructed to write a letter of complaint.

Although the R.D.C. promised in a letter dated 3.rd March 1959 to complete the cinder path and turning space on the roadway across W. Green the work has not been completed. The Clerk was instructed to write regarding this.

Owing to the illness of Mr Watson this matter has not been pressed, but as he has returned to business, a further reminder will now be given. A letter to R.D.C. is to be sent ~~soon~~ asking for further action in the matter.
