Members Present. Messrs S Joyce Thomas (chairman) J. H. Brown, Y. Vincent, A. Dent, G. H. West, and the clerk, Mr Jas Scott; also Mr G. H. Widge, Sanitary Inspector, Rural District Council, and Mr H. A. Crompton, Asst. Sanitary Inspector.

Minutes of Previous Meeting. The minutes of the previous meeting were read, confirmed, and signed.

Town Planning. A letter was read from the Rural District Council, acknowledging the Parish Council's letter as to the formation of the Town Planning Committee, and stating that it had been decided to add the names of Messrs J. H. Brown, and G. H. West to the committee, but that otherwise they could not alter the constitution of the committee.

It was proposed by Mr J. Vincent, seconded by Mr G. H. West, that the clerk write to Mr Barralet, asking him how the matter of the Town Planning scheme was progressing, and suggesting that a meeting of the committee be called, at an early date, suitable to Mr Barralet.

Footpaths. The chairman asked the committee to seriously take up the question of footpaths, and suggested the making up of one, at least, this winter, and asked Mr Dent to make a special point of seeing it carried through.

Polling
Station

Letters were read from the County Council, and Mr A. S. Daniell stating that the question of a Polling Station for Tatsfield had been referred to the General Purposes Committee.

The clerk was instructed to write to the County Council asking if any decision had been arrived at.

Inspection

Mr E. H. Widge (Sanitary Inspector Rural District Council) presented his report on the recent House to House Inspection, which covered 110 houses.

A discussion, in committee, followed.

It was resolved on the proposition of Mr J. Vincent, seconded by Mr J. Brown that certain houses be first dealt with, viz Brockley Cottage, Ham Hill, Newell's House, Goatfields Rd, and Glass House Cottage, Goatfields Road, which Mr Widge promised would be done.

Cesspool

The chairman asked Mr Widge to present the Council with a workable scheme, in reply to which, Mr Widge said that he would consult Mr Barratt as to the cost of a cesspool, and house to house collection of dust, and report at the Parish Council's next meeting.

Thanks were accorded Mr Widge for his comprehensive report, who in acknowledging said that he would be pleased to attend a meeting of the Council, at any time, and

to render any assistance in his power.

Rag Hill.

A letter was read from Mr A Duddy enclosing one from Mr Broughton containing certain proposals with regard to the suggested widening of Rag Hill.

Referred to Committee.

Technical Education.

Resolved that a class for the instruction of Nursing, in conjunction with the Surrey Education Committee, be approved, and that the Surrey County Council be authorized to make such differential rate, not exceeding 1/8d per £ to meet the expenses of the same, provided the said class is held rent free at the Village Hall.

A local Committee composed of the Rev G H Marten, Mr Smith, Mr J H Brown and Mr G H West having been appointed at the Council's meeting of 2nd June 1910.

Resolved that the clerk write to the Rev G H Marten for report.

Lighting

Resolved that the Clerk be empowered to sign the Lighting Contract, on behalf of the Parish Council.

Proposed by Mr Vincent, seconded by Mr Brown that cheques for £3-10-6 & 15/- be drawn for payment of Lamp lighters wages & painting of standards.

The Chairman said that he & Mr Brown had visited Rag Hill & considered Mr Moughton's proposal for widening Rag Hill & deviating the foot-path. They were not clear as to the ownership of the land (plot 23) through which Mr Moughton proposes the foot-path should run to the stile. He suggested writing to Mr Moughton thanking him for his letters & plan, & asking him to clear up the point of ownership. This was seconded by Mr Vincent & carried.
