7. INFORMATION.

Official information will be received by Captain Dalton who will pass it to the wardens, Mrs Perkins, Mr Thomas, Mr Vincent and Mr Sudier, and to the Post Office.

The public must be warned no news or orders can be considered official unless received through one of the sources detailed above or from a known Home Guard Officer or a known Police Officer.

9. FOOD.

Mr Hall (RDC Offices Cirencester) Ciren 616) is responsible for the distribution of food to the villages as long as this remains possible. If all communication breaks down the Voluntary Food Officer (Capt Belton) assumes this responsibility and will have powers of requisitioning.

A list of amounts to be issued per household has been deposited with those persons in charge of outlying dumps. These lists must be kept up to date and easily available. The list for the main store will be kept in duplicate with the two copies of this War Book.

Full information with reference to these rations with instructions ~~with~~ as to how they will be drawn and from where, has been given in writing to every household. If the village becomes isolated a committee consisting of the Deputy Food organiser, Mrs Perkins and the local farmers will be called to advise the VFO as to the best method of rationing available food stocks

Emergency rations for 8 days are held in store in the village as follows.

At Lady Birchall's for Cotswold Farm, the Dyers, The Saddlers, the Wells, the Workmen, and the Rucks.
At Mrs Perkins' for Duntisbourne House, the Lockes, the Hamms, the Hicks, & the Stantons.
At Mrs Bradshaw for Jackbarrow, the Pontings & the

Rations for all other persons resident in the parish, including the Home Guard, are held in store at Windmill. The ration is as under:

7½ lbs	Biscuits	per person.
1½ lb	corned beef	per person.
1 lb	Pork & Beans	"
1 lb	sugar	"
7½ oz	condensed milk	"
7½ oz	margarine	"
2 oz	of tea	"

These emergency rations are only to be issued on instructions received from Cirencester, probably on action stations being notified.

If communication with Cirencester breaks down the rations will be issued at the discretion of the VFO.

In any case they are not to be issued on the notification of "Reid action stations".

If the military authorities order the outlying households to come into the village Lady Birchall Mrs Perkins and Mrs Bradshaw will issue their rations without further instructions.

15. EMERGENCY LABOUR.

Under Invasion conditions a call may be made for emergency labour to assist the military, remove casualties, dig trenches etc.

The following will be available in addition to the wardens. Mr Seddons, Hoyle, S White, Bangs, J Reeves, Brunton, Stewart, Brunsden, Watkins, Dean, Stanton, Hicks, Penstree Sedgwick senr & junr.

A list of picks, shovels spades crowbars across cut saws ladders etc is kept with this book.

The method of calling out a working party will depend on circumstances. The Police (if available) and the Youth Squad can be made use of. Mr Sedgwick or Mr Thomas might be put in charge of the party depending on which end of the village the party was required.

16. THE VILLAGE SCHOOL.

The village school will close if Action Stations is notified.
