Kimbolton & Stonely Parish Council recently held an interesting and well attended Crime Prevention Evening in the Hall. Speakers included Smartwater - a dab-it-on forensic marking technology which increases the traceability of your valuables. PCSO Richard Braddick From Cambridgeshire Constabulary spoke about how to keep yourself, your business and your property safe, not just from burglars but scammers and con men, of which there has been an increase in recent years. Richard reported on the number and variety of crimes over the last few years and noted that the statistics have remained fairly consistent. Blueline Security who operate a mobile nightly patrol explained about what they do, how they started and how members can join the scheme. They also spoke about the type of incidences they see whilst out on patrol, Daniel Smith From Protec Security Services provides CCTV, alarms, security lighting and motion sensors to both households and commercial premises. Whilst crime will never be eradicated individuals have to take responsibility for their own security and try to deter crime from the locality.

Main Hall Lights

Sadly we have to report yet another issue with the lights in the main hall whereby one of the units occasionally flickers. We informed the supplier in July and asked them to attend to the problem. We subsequently discovered that the 3 units we replaced in January were from a faulty batch. In view of this the committee decided to retrofit the remaining 5 units and requested that this be done in August when the hall is not so busy. The supplier sent 2 replacements and some weeks later another 2, we have chased them daily for the final item but as at the date of writing it has still not been received. The problem we have is that in order to complete the exchange we need to hire a tower and an electrician and it only makes sense to do this when all the replacements are available. We appreciate the patience of our users and can assure you that as soon as we receive the last unit we will get everything exchanged as soon as possible thereafter.
