Miss Frank's Sale will once again fill up the main hall with all sorts of goodies on Saturday 27 April.

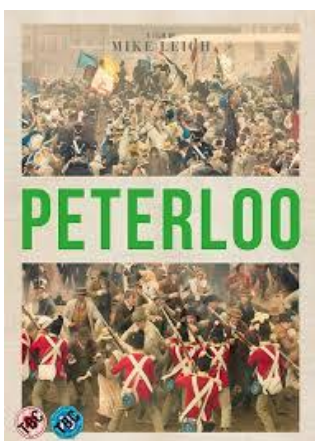
EASTER PARADE Friday 19 April

PETERLOO Friday 17 May



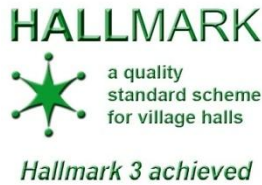
