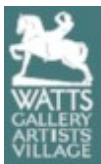

James Henry Pullen (1835-1916) was an extraordinary Victorian. Despite being institutionalised all his life due to his disabilities he was able to express himself as an imaginative, innovative and witty creator of a range of artistic works.
