Thankfully things have now mostly returned to normality from the Coronavirus pandemic.

We are now having our PC meetings face to face and masks are no longer necessary in shops, public houses and most other public places.

It is very pleasing that the first phase of Thornley Village Hall has eventually been completed and that we were able to have our Parish Council Meeting there for the first time on Monday 8th November 2021 since it was closed for renovation.

Little Town Farm Shop continues to go from strength to strength and the first floor extended cafe area is a great addition.

Another massive improvement in the area is the first phase of work done on Thornley Bridle Path or Grassy Lane as the locals call it.
