## Rule of 20

The Rule of 20 is a guideline for deciding whether to open the bidding. It attempts to refine traditional high card point count by also taking suit length into consideration. The rule is pretty simple: add your high card points plus the number of cards in your two longest suits. If the total is 20 or more, then the hand is worth an opening bid.

## Examples

- **♣** T8
- **♥** KT973
- **•** 6
- ♣ AK865

10 HCP + 5 hearts + 5 clubs = 20. Open 1♥ in accordance with the Rule of 20.

- ♣ AQ9
- **#** AJ63
- ♦ JT2
- **♣** 754

12 HCP + 4 hearts + 3 of any other suit = 19. Pass.

## **Origins**

The Rule of 20 was popularized by American expert Marty Bergen in the 1990s.
