

Parish Council Information

A summary of Parish Council goings-on at the July and August Meetings:

During the public session in July discussions included: if there were any grants available for ponds and if so could the one in Gainsford End be re-instated. The state of footpaths and repair of the village gates.

In July parish council business included:

- Chris Neale was co-opted onto the parish council giving a full complement of Councillors.
- Parish Council policies continue to be reviewed and updated.
- It was agreed to arrange a waste collection vehicle to visit the parish in September.

In August District Councillor Richard van Dulken reported:

- Angela Rayner wants to make changes to the planning process, but this should not affect Toppesfield greatly.
- Housing targets for each authority have been increased. Braintree's has increased to 1098 per year. Also, there is a push forward for larger schemes i.e. solar farms, pylons and inland wind farms.
- The Councillors Community Grant fund is open for applications.
- He is now on the Essex Pension Fund advisory board.

Other business included: the speed of traffic through the parish, overhanging vegetation and the condition of some of the footpaths. A tree planting project is being looked into but locations for the trees need to be found. A waste collection vehicle has been booked and will be in attendance at the phone box in Gainsford End from 10am to 10.50am and from 11am to 1pm at the Pump in Toppesfield.

Those that have visited the site recently will notice that the orchard grass has been cut in anticipation of a picnic area, which I will be laying to lawn in October.

WHAT TO GROW

Planting in September is a good idea as it provides you with an earlier crop in spring, makes use of otherwise empty soil and saves you time on spring planting. Plenty of vegetables and flowers can be sown or planted in the UK in September, including hardy annuals like pot marigold and love-in-a-mist, which will bloom a couple of weeks earlier than those from a spring sowing. In the vegetable patch, crops like garlic and broad beans can be planted now, for earlier harvests the following spring and summer.

Compost any weeds and spent crops before the winter, we have a compost heap at the rear of the Fire heap.

This has been a wet season, but a very productive one .Allotment Newbies have done extremely well.

Well done Hayley and Annie !!!!!! its so nice to see the kids getting out at the allotments and getting some great fresh air.

Vegetable Bed

Vegetables to plant in September

Spinach



Sowing spinach in a seed drill

Spinach can be sown now for pickings next spring. Sow direct in shallow drills in well-prepared soil, or in pots. Cover with fleece or a low cloche from October onwards.

Sowing broad beans in autumn means plants can establish over winter and crop earlier the following spring. Cover plants with fleece during hard frosts or snow. Try broad bean 'Aquadulce Claudia', which does well from an autumn sowing.

Like broad beans, hardy peas can be sown in September to overwinter and produce an early crop. Choose winter-hardy varieties like 'Douce Provence' or 'Meteor'.

Speeding Vehicles through the parish



The Parish Council have received various complaints about vehicles speeding through our parish. The complaints are not just about farm vehicles, which because of their size appear intimidating especially at speed but all types of vehicles.

Whilst it is difficult to identity those who do speed through the village, as they are not usually residents, one local contractor has asked if you see any farm vehicles speeding please can you note where and when the speeding occurs and what type of vehicle it was. Also if you can get a registration or photo this would help to identify the drivers and which landowner the vehicle belongs to more efficiently. Such information can be passed to the parish clerk

Each summer concerns are raised due to the increased pedestrian and cycle presence on our roads. But speeding vehicles are a concern all year round. Our rural location means vision is restricted and roads are more dangerous winter.

The Parish Council are making enquires into speed calming measures to go alongside or reduce the current 30mph speed limit in parts of the parish. However this would not be something which would happen quickly as projects such as this have to go through Essex Highways.

The parish council has arranged with Braintree District Council for an Amenity Vehicle to come to Toppesfield and Gainsford End on Saturday 21st September 2024.

The vehicle is for general household waste, including kettles, irons, microwaves and small TVs.

Please note that it will not take asbestos, liquids, tyres and white goods and the operatives will refuse any such items.

The vehicle will be at the telephone box in Gainsford End from 10am to 10.50am and from 11am to 1pm at the Pump in Toppesfield, (opposite the Green Man pub).

Please note the change of rules, a list of POP's items no longer allowed to be picked up are shown below:

- Sofas
- Sofa beds
- Armchairs
- Kitchen & dining room chairs (containing any upholstery)
- Stools & footstools (containing any upholstery)
- Home office chairs (containing any upholstery)
- Futons
- Bean bags, floor and sofa cushions


Including any part made of or containing leather, synthetic leather, other fabric or foam.


BREWERY

It's been a busy summer at the brewery and it looks as though it will continue that way for the rest of the year.

It always seems perverse to start thinking about winter and Christmas in the height of summer but such is the need to plan ahead that we have no choice!

Our Christmas Ale this year will build on previous years' successful brews but with some extra twists this time. A deep amber coloured brew with hints of winter spices will produce a warming drink with subtle overtones from the ginger, clove, cinnamon and cardamon that will be introduced to the brew just before filtering into the fermenters.

We will also be bringing back out popular strong stout. This will be having a bit of a makeover, not in the brew itself but in its name and branding. We have decided to rename the beer as 'Snake Island Stout', produce a new label and make a donation from each bottle sold to British-Ukrainian Aid, a Charity Registered in England and Wales (Reg no.1164472)

The charity supports the work done to assist people suffering from the war and the resulting humanitarian crisis in Ukraine, including the injured and wounded, orphaned children, the elderly, internally displaced persons, refugees and families who have lost their main earners.

More immediately, we will be holding our own Oktoberfest, following on from last year's successful event. This will be held on Sunday 29th September in the Pallet Bar at the brewery (before you ask why we would hold an Oktoberfest in September, in Munich the Oktoberfest is held from 21 September to 6th October: perhaps it should be Septoberfest?).

We will have a selection of Pumphouse beers, some wine and soft drinks and there will be a barbecue with burgers and sausages.

Historical interest

Going through the old newsletters I thought that there were a couple of items of real importance to the village.

Gainsford End Windmill - A fine tower mill built in 1869 by John Eley and had three sets of stones. A pulley wheel added so that one set of stones could be driven by a steam engine. Last worked in early 1930's. Added to and converted into house in 2006.

St Margaret's Church Toppesfield Bells - Bell tower and ringing chamber refurbished and bells repaired, and new ones cast so now we have a tower of eight bells. Bells dedicated in 2008.

What an amazing village Toppesfield is. We are so lucky to live here.

Please forgive me if I have recorded any of the dates incorrectly.

From the past.....Great Yeldham Station



Great Yeldham Station in 1968

Located on the north side of Toppesfield Lane, the station opened in 1860, two years after the station was first meant to open. This is because of a dispute between the Eastern Counties Railway, Colne Valley and Halsted Railway delayed the opening building until the line was complete. As with many rural lines, the popularity of the motor car quickened the decline of many stations, including Yeldham.

Yeldham's passenger service was eventually withdrawn in December 1961. But freight traffic lasted until April 1965 and the track was lifted the following year. In 1973 however, two railway enthusiasts put forward a proposal to rebuild a short section of the railway to operate a steam service as a tourist attraction. After several planning applications, permission was granted to relay a mile of the line west of Castle Hedingham. The first steam train subsequently went through the line in August 1973.

The track bed through the station was cleared of vegetation a few years ago and is now a public footpath.



This can be weekly, fortnightly or monthly depending on your availability and the needs of the person you are befriending. **Transport**- transport to hospital appointments, social events, shopping. Again this may be weekly, fortnightly or monthly.

Help with fundraising events- running a stall, providing prizes for raffles or cakes for refreshments. **Lunch club helpers-** people to help with transport, cooking, serving food, clearing up, washing up. Chatting with our visitors.

Outings group- help with transport, organising outings.

Trustees- we are planning to become an independent charity and are looking for trustees. If you would like to have a say in the running of the charity and can spare an evening every couple of months for a meeting, we'd love to hear from you.
