# Parish Council Information

A summary of Parish Council goings-on at the May and June meetings:

In May Cllr Richard van Dulken reported:

- The Waste recycling review decision will be taken at the cabinet meeting at the end of May and any changes will take place from April 2026.
- Cllr Schwier and he have taken a tour of some of the local roads to photograph and request that some of the potholes are treated as priority.

Other business in May included:

- Councillor Kitty Bourlet was elected as Chair for 2025 – 2026
- Councillor Edwards-Holmes was elected as vice-chair for 2025-2026
- Cllr Edwards-Holmes completed an application to Certas Energy for Community Bloom Fund.
- Strategy Document distribution—this will be delivered alongside the May/June parish newsletter.
- VE Day celebrations – final plans were discussed.
- Christmas planning began.
- Cost for equipment needed to redecorate the Telephone box in Toppesfield were agreed.
- Cllr Neale has raised with Google that Church Lane is not suitable for vehicles , however this will take time to update their mapping services.

In June Cllr Richard van Dulken reported:

Cllr Richard van Dulken reported:

- Braintree District Council (BDC) have 5 leisure facilities who are changing supplier from the 1<sup>st</sup> September 2025.
- Waste & Recycling - at the cabinet meeting on 25<sup>th</sup> July 2025 it was agreed the changes to waste bins and collections will come into effect from June 2026 and communications regarding this will be sent to each household.
- Local Plan, call for sites. The sites submitted for Toppesfield will be discussed on 25<sup>th</sup> June 2025.
- Grants – Cllr van Dulken was not able to support the VE Day grant application but will look at supporting another project this year.
- Other grants available from BDC are the cost-of-living grant scheme and the Rural England prosperity fund. More information about these can be found on their website.

Other business in the June meeting included:

- The lack of lighting from the centre of the village to Camoise Close was raised as there is no footpath for people to walk along – Cllr Edwards-Holmes will contact Highways to see if there could be a solution to this.
- It was mentioned that the hedge that runs along the junction of Great Yeldham Road and The Causeway is encroaching into the road and is obscuring a clear view for traffic. It was agreed that an article will be placed in the newsletter and on Facebook reminding people of the rules around hedges and the road-side.
- Strategy Document – some responses have been received so far, a reminder will be put on Facebook and an article in the next newsletter with an extended date to the end of July. Responses will be discussed at the August meeting.
- The updated Emergency Plan was approved.
- Doctor Car service - Cllr Edwards-Holmes will produce an updated process of the service for councillors for review .



In castle formed through shared delight.



What to plant in July on the TOPPESFIELD allotment plots.

Planting in July on your allotment is all about making the most of the remaining summer and planning for autumn and winter harvests. Here's what you can plant in July in the plot.

**Vegetables to Sow/Plant in July**

Direct Sow Outdoors:

**Carrots** – Choose fast-maturing varieties like 'Adelaide' or 'Amsterdam Forcing'.

**Beetroot** – 'Boltardy' or other bolt-resistant types do well.

**Turnips** – Quick to mature and great for late summer and autumn harvests.

**Spring onions** – Ideal for late summer salads.

**Radishes** – Fast-growing and perfect for quick succession sowing.

**Lettuce** – Choose heat-resistant or bolt-resistant varieties.

**Spinach** – Opt for late-season types, like 'Perpetual Spinach'.

**Pak choi & oriental greens** – Best sown later in the month to avoid bolting.

**Swiss chard** – Hardy and colourful; will crop well into winter.



## **Toppesfield Allotment news continued**

For Autumn & Winter Cropping:

**Kale** – Sow now for harvests well into winter.

**Cabbage (late varieties)** – 'January King' or savoy types.

**Leeks** – Transplant if you sowed them earlier.

**Purple sprouting broccoli** – Transplant seedlings for next spring harvest.

In the Greenhouse or Indoors:

**French beans (dwarf)** – Quick crops if started under cover.

**Coriander & parsley** – Sow in pots for continued harvest into autumn.

**Basil** – Loves the warmth; great in pots or greenhouse.

Flowers for Pollinators & Companion Planting:

**Calendula (pot marigold)** – Easy, edible flowers.

**Nasturtiums** – Great for attracting aphid predators.

**Borage** – Excellent for bees and adds beauty to your allotment.

Other Jobs in July:

Keep sowing **succession crops** (radishes, salad leaves).

Harvest and dry out **garlic** and early **onions**.

Start preparing beds for **autumn planting** (e.g. green manures).


We welcome all to our Community Coffee Afternoons so please look out for details of future dates. There is always plenty of cake! You can contact the school office for details.

# Hedge and Tree Cutting Information from Essex Highways website.

## Guidelines below:



### **Grass cutting**

Cutting the grass of highway verges is undertaken by Essex County Council to ensure the safety of road users and takes place during the late Spring and Autumn months.

Essex Highways is only responsible for cutting the grass verges in rural areas, normally twice a year. If you notice a problem with overgrown vegetation you can [Tell us online](#). In specific areas, verges may contain protected plants and cutting can only take place at certain times of the year.

District, borough and city councils deliver urban and rural cuts on our behalf except for rural cuts in Epping Forest, Uttlesford, Colchester and Tendring which are delivered by us.

### **Overgrown vegetation**

Along with our grass verge cutting and weed spraying residents can do their bit to help by looking after the area outside your home or property and encourage your neighbours and community to do the same.


### **Vegetation on (or from) private land**

We don't look after trees, hedges and shrubs on private land, including land that is next to roads and pavements. Most trees and hedges by roads are on land owned by private land-owners, district councils, city council, parish councils, housing associations and homeowners. It is the landowner's responsibility to look after these areas. They have a duty of care to take reasonable steps to prevent or reduce as far as possible, the risk of injury or damage that could be caused to anyone else - [Highways Act 1980](#).

Examples are:

- overgrown vegetation reducing the available pavement width for pedestrians - vegetation should be kept back to the property boundary.
- overhanging vegetation reducing the height for pedestrians or cyclists on the pavement or cycleway - low hanging vegetation should be cut back so there is a clearance of 2.4m (8ft) over a pavement or cycleway.
- overhanging vegetation that reduces the height or clearance of the road for tall vehicles such as double deck school buses - low hanging vegetation should be cut back so there is a clearance of 5.1m (16ft 9in) over a road.
- overhanging vegetation reducing the width or blocking the view of the road - vegetation should be kept back to the property boundary.
- a damaged or diseased tree that is in danger of falling onto the road or pavement - these should be treated or removed, where possible.

overgrown vegetation obscuring road signs or street lights - vegetation should be cut back for visibility.
