THREE ARRESTS FOLLOWING DISPERSAL ORDER



WITHAM

While policing the dispersal order Halloween night, officers carried out two separate stop searches, each resulting in the recovery of a knife.

In the first incident, a 15-year-old boy was arrested on suspicion of possessing an offensive weapon.

In the second, a 23-year-old man was arrested under the same suspicion.

Both individuals were taken into custody and interviewed.

These incidents are not linked, and no one was injured.

Enquiries remain ongoing.

Separately, on Saturday 1st November evening, a third individual—a 16-year-old boy—was arrested and has since been charged with possession of a knife.

He is due to appear at Chelmsford Magistrates' Court later this month.

That's three more knives off our streets.

Essex Police say"If you have any information about knives or other weapons in our community, please report it to Essex Police or anonymously with Crimestoppers.

THEFTS FROM SHEDS

It is worth advising you what a local Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator said to me this week. "(Thefts from) outbuildings/garden sheds is a good indication of low level crime in the neighbourhood. If they've tried your shed, you can bet they've also checked to see if your back door has been left unlocked" ...

A recent shed burglary local to him had chainsaws, a hedge cutter, angle grinder etc..stolen all valued at £1,000...by going through the back gardens.

My knowledge of such thefts also include checking that the back panels of a shed are secured too, as it has been discovered that the panels have been taken away and items stolen and it was not noticed a until the doors were open......

ESSEX POLICE ADVICE : SHED BURGLARIES

There have been quite a few shed burglaries locally in the past week or two ...So first check that your insurance covers the contents of your shed from theft.



Think like a thief..Take a look at your shed and consider how you would break in. It's worth having a good padlock on the door with no exposed screws. Pay attention to hinges, as these are sometimes easily removable. If you have windows then these could be vulnerable unless they're secured with wire mesh or grills. And keep it locked at all times. Alarm it: Consider a battery-operated shed alarm. They look low key but they respond to movement or door contact with an extremely loud siren. Lock it, hide it or mark it: Don't give them the opportunity or the tools to commit a crime.

Lock everything away securely. Tools can be locked inside a locker or box or secured with a chain. Secure your bike to the ground or a lockable stand within a locked shed .. It's always worth draping an old sheet or blanket over the top of mowers or bikes to keep them covered from view. Never leave your shed door unlocked if you're not around. Keep the door closed between uses so that no one can see what's inside. Property mark your items and take photographs of them. Some tools can be painted with your name or postcode and forensic marking is also an option.

You can also register any item that has a serial number with Immobilise. A locksmith belonging to the Master Locksmiths Association can advise you on the most secure shed security. They can also help you install it. Most also provide full home security surveys. The top five most common items stolen from sheds are Bikes, Mowers, Sports equipment, Power tools, Garden tools
