DIANE PASFIELD ESSEX FIRE & RESCUE SERVICES



I joined Essex County Fire & Rescue Service in the Emergency Control Room 31 years ago. I was responsible for answering 999 calls and mobilising fire service resources, which is a joint role as every call to the Fire Service is mobilised to immediately. During 27 years I rose to the rank of Fire Control Officer, responsible for decision making to ensure the efficient running of the **Emergency Control Room & that sufficient resources are** available in all areas of Essex, moving them around where necessary. Large incidents include - Boeing 747 crash at Stansted Airport 1999 & Lattended in the Control Unit to the Hijack a few years later, the large fire at Southend Pier, fire in the maltings at Manningtree - the largest incident for me 27 pumps - over 140 personnel, large chemical incidents, many types of rescues including one where it was covered on the 999 television programme. Four years ago I moved into Community Safety & now one of my main roles is to visit vulnerable people in their homes and give them fire safety advice specific to their needs. For example bedbound or confined to property, those with specific or complicated medical needs and hoarders. It is really important for ECFRS to know about these properties before we arrive so that the fire crews can plan on route to protect themselves and to help the members of the public quickly on arrival. I have also completed an Essex Police Crime Prevention Basic Course. Making every contact count. Another large part of my role is to attend meetings with partner agencies e.g. local authorities, Community Safety Partnerships, charities, housing, Social Care etc to share information so that the members of the public are safer in The information I gain from their community. Neighbourhood Watch is so important to be able to share with the people that I visit. Every opportunity counts to spread life saving advice.
