We are clearly in a better place than we were 12 months ago, following the impressive roll-out of the vaccine programme. For the vaccinated, even if covid is caught, the impact is much less severe than was the case in January last year.

## **Toppesfield Parish Paths**

#### Hi Everyone

Happy New Year! I hope you all had an enjoyable Christmas. I have just looked back at January 2021 edition of the newsletter and so sad to see that we are still in the grip of covid. Still walking as ever is so important for us all so do enjoy it.

Oh the wet. The river is brimming its banks and many of the cross field paths are now impassable but still we can find places to walk and things to look out for and enjoy. Fantastic carpets of leaves of all colours still decorate the footpaths and I cannot resist scuffing through them! The leaves are so important to the soil as they rot down, helped by earthworms, other invertebrates, bacteria and fungi to make nutritious compost and fertiliser for the next season.





Another thing that I always like to see is that as the leaves fall off and the trees are left bare you can see the birds nests used this season. Hopefully, with a bit of DIY, they will be reused this coming Spring and perhaps provide some shelter in the Winter.

There are already signs of Spring with the Hazel catkins making an appearance. The catkins are the male flowers shedding pollen. The female

flower is just a little tuft of red hairs coming out of a bud and, when pollinated, that is where the nuts will develop. The branches also have a coating of lichen on them to paint the hedgerow.

I did report in the last edition of the newsletter that the bridge over the brook beyond Ollivers has moved again having been repaired earlier in the year. I have reported it to highways ProW team but as yet nothing has been done about it so if walking that way please take care.

## Wethersfield Airfield Prison Proposal Update

Well, many people think that following the Ministry of Justice (MoJ) Consultation that closed December 8<sup>th</sup>, there is nothing happening as we await the Planning Application. That couldn't be further from the truth!

Many Parish Councils, as well as many individuals, responded to the Consultation document. Several Parish Councils met and as a result the Wethersfield Airbase Scrutiny Committee (WASC) has been formed to consider, respond, suggest and actively engage with all stakeholders in connection with development proposals involving Wethersfield. The Committee is formed under the statute of the Local Government Act 1972 Section 102 and is made up of representatives from various affected Parish Councils.

The MoJ has proposed the extent of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) needed to support the Planning Application in a Scoping Opinion letter to Braintree District Council (BDC). There is a structure to an EIA for a development of this size, and the MoJ has proposed to BDC that some of the sections of the EIA need not be completed. If BDC (the authority that will receive the Planning Application) agrees, this means that specific areas of investigation will not be carried out.

This Scoping Opinion letter was sent to Finchingfield Parish Council for comment but the response has been made by WASC on behalf of all involved Parish Councils. The following is an extract from the response:

"The WASC considers that this site should never have been selected as a possibility for prisons of this scale. The location has poor accessibility, will have a dramatic impact on the landscape, ecology and character of the surrounding countryside, cause untold loss of amenity caused by increased traffic over a very wide area which is characterized by country lanes, open varied countryside, historic villages, scattered farmsteads. The proposals are wholly contrary to local and national planning policy and at odds with current and emerging prisons strategy - the site should have been discounted at an earlier stage. Had this been a scheme by a housing developer it is inconceivable that this scheme would have been entertained."

The Scoping Opinion letter itself actually says:

"The policies map shows that the application site is not allocated for development and is located in a 'countryside area'. There are three Protected Wildlife Sites identified at the site within the Development Plan. The site is not allocated for development in the emerging Draft Proposals Map. The site was not considered as a development site in the emerging Local Plan. The proposed development is contrary to the Development Plan and the policies in the emerging Local Plan."

Parish Council activities are controlled in detail by legislation so that activities such as fundraising or very swift reactions may be difficult or simply not possible. In recognition of that, and in order to involve as many people as possible in trying to stop the proposed development, a group of people from the villages which will be affected by the proposed development got together in early December to form a Residents' Association – Stop Wethersfield Airfield Prison or SWAP. Membership of this Association will open early in the new year, but it has already been active.

A SWAP page has been established in Facebook, Instagram (SWAP Wethersfield), and there is a Twitter account. All of these social media pages contain a lot of information. (Please note that an earlier FB page, open to all, may be taken down shortly.)

## Wethersfield Airfield Prison Proposal Update cont..

SWAP founder members put questions to Braintree District Council at the December meeting and held a demonstration outside their offices, a protest was held in Finchingfield, a Parliamentary Petition has been started https:// petition.parliament.uk/petitions/603619, more suitable alternative uses for the airfield have been developed, and many, many letters have been written. The Chair of SWAP has experience in fighting against – and winning – large unsuitable developments and there are lots of people with relevant skills involved.

The two groups – WASC and SWAP – will be working very closely together throughout what might be a very long process.

#### Hope is not lost!

Please keep in touch by using the social media pages detailed above, joining SWAP once it is open to membership, responding to any Planning Applications, signing the petition and writing letters – to Braintree District Council, to James Cleverly, to the Ministry of Justice and others.

The committee wish them the very best of luck in their next endeavours and we look forward to working with them over their 6 month notice period to ensure a stable and smooth transition.

#### A few more trees planted ...well, 300 actually!

If you walk around the playing field any time soon you're likely to see what looks like a thicket of bamboo canes across the bottom of the field, alongside the eastern edge and along the fence bordering the school playing field. These support the 300 native hedging tree whips which were planted between Christmas and the New Year by a stalwart small band of volunteers.

Well done to Victoria, George, Bill and Alora, to Andy and Rosie and to the Collards.



Four other families had planned to join in but were hit by omicron or had other commitments and so have to wait for another opportunity. Fortunately for them. there will be another chance since we have 30 more to plant and a number of other associated jobs to do before leaving nature to get on with her part!

We are also planning to put up the bird boxes that some children made at Messy Church during the February half



We are a family of 4, our children are Callum who is 6yrs old and Chloe who is 4. Both are pupils at St Margret's Primary School in Toppesfield, Callum is currently going through a diagnosis for a condition called Neurofibromatosis (NF1)

Complications may include:

- Tumours growing along nerves on the skin and inside the body
- Bone Deformities/Scoliosis (eg Curvature of the spine)
- Sight Problems/Blindness
- Social Skill Difficulties (eg Autistic Spectrum Disorder)
- Attention and Impulsivity (eg ADD/ADHD)

The condition is incurable and will involve constant testing and monitoring for the rest of his life.

Callum's dad was discussing Callum's condition to his friend and co-worker Andy Cooper, who was inspired to do something. So he came up with the idea to walk the 4 highest peaks, in 4 days for 4 reasons.
