## Parish Council Information

A summary of Parish Council goings-on at the May and June meetings:

At the May meeting:

Cllr Nathan Robins introduced himself and then reported:

- That reform have already written to the secretary of state to oppose the local government reorganisation.
- They are reversing the reserving fee at libraries.
- They are launching DOLGE – Department of Local Government Efficiency
- The Highways contract is being looked at and why it was not put out to tender.
- Cllr Robins will chase up progress of local pothole repair with Highways.

A resident from Gainsford End reported that some of the footpaths around Gainsford End have not been maintained. Cllr Neale confirmed that once landowners have been identified the parish council will write to them asking to reinstate/maintain the footpaths.

Cllr Richard van Dulken reported:

- Braintree District Council are continuing to work with Colchester, Tendring and Essex County Council towards the creation of the unity authority North East Essex.
- New waste collections being in June. Schedules for collections and information are currently being sent out.
- Special collections for Absorbent Hygiene Products are available. Full details, including eligibility criteria, accepted items and how to apply, are available on the Council website: <https://www.braintree.gov.uk/ahpcollections>
- Wethersfield Asylum Centre currently has 768 residents.
- The bus museum in Great Yeldham is now open.
- £50,000 has been awarded to Konect buses who have taken over Hedingham buses towards new services from Great Yeldham and the Hedingham's to Braintree, Colchester and Sudbury.
- The Councillor's Community Grant fund pot this year is £1700 and is now open for applications.

Other business in the May meeting included:

- The internal audit report was received and an action plan agreed to address the points raised.
- The Annual return was completed for submission to the external auditors.
- A quote for digitalising the old newsletters was received—further ones being sought.
- Parking along Church Lane near the school and other areas in the village. This has been reported to North Essex Parking Partnership.

## Parish Council Information continued.

At the June meeting:

CLlr Richard van Dulken sent in his report as follows:

As you may be aware, I have been elected as Chairman of BDC for the coming civic year, which will involve a hundred or so official visits, ribbon cuttings etc. as representative of the Council and District.

- I have put comments on the Planning Portal re the proposed solar farm development, 1) asking that Toppesfield (and Stambourne) PCs be consultees as almost all of the solar farm would be in both Parishes and 2) in view of the sensitive location I strongly urge that an Environmental Impact Assessment be required before going any further.
- Wethersfield - as far as I'm aware the numbers of residents is still below the 800 limit and there have been no incidents to mention.
- There has been some progress on the long-awaited Hedingham Medical Centre - the developers One Medical Property have signed off with NHS and should be able to begin works shortly.
- I look forward to your request for a grant from my Councillor's Community Grant (£300) towards the wildlife area in the Rec.

Representatives from Robin Hood End attended to present their case re the planning app no: 26/01110/SCR, Proposed Solar farm development at Robin Hood Solar Farm, Finchingfield Road, Stambourne. They urged the parish council to write to the Braintree District Council to request a full environmental impact assessment is carried out. The parish council discussed this later in the meeting and submitted a response to BDC.

A resident asked if there was any progress on the previously reported blocked drains. Five blocked or partially blocked drains around Cust Hall have been reported to Highways.

Other business in the June meeting included:

- Coral Fordham was co-opted onto the parish council to fill the advertised vacancy.
- Updated policies were approved, a grant was approved and the strategy document discussed.

# Toppesfield Allotments

**July and August at Toppesfield Allotment:** peak growing season jobs.

July and August are the busiest months on UK allotments - including Toppesfield. You'll be harvesting daily, keeping up with watering, and prepping for autumn crops. Here's what to focus on:

**July:** Keep it growing

## **Veg tasks:**

- Feed weekly: Tomatoes, peppers, cucumbers, courgettes and sweetcorn love a liquid feed once fruits set
- Pinch & prune: Pinch out tomato side shoots + top them after 4-5 trusses. Pinch runner bean tips when they hit the cane tops
- Harvest early potatoes and re-sow the space with salad leaves or French beans
- Last sowings: Dwarf French beans for Sept, spring cabbage, beetroot, fennel, kohlrabi
- Plant out: Winter brassicas - kale, sprouts, purple sprouting broccoli. Firm soil well
- Lift garlic, onions & shallots: Do it on a dry day, leave on soil to dry thoroughly

## **Fruit tasks:**

- Summer prune gooseberries, red/white currants, blackcurrants after fruiting.
- Prune trained apples/pears: Shorten side shoots to 3-5 leaves.
- Net cherries before birds get them.
- Last rhubarb harvest, then mulch crowns well.

## **General**

- Water morning or evening to reduce evaporation. Containers need it most.
- Weed & hoe regularly - weeds wilt fast if hoed off in sun.
- Watch pests: Aphids, cabbage white caterpillars, carrot fly, slugs

**August:** Harvest + prep for autumn

## **Veg tasks**

- Harvest everything: Peas, beans, carrots, beetroot, sweetcorn, tomatoes, potatoes, onions, salads, courgettes.
- Keep watering - promotes growth and stops bolting
- Sow now: Spring cabbage, turnips, oriental veg, spinach, lamb's lettuce for winter
- Greenhouse: Ventilate daily, keep feeding tomatoes/cucumbers/peppers, harvest often.

### **Fruit tasks:**

- Summer-prune apples & pears - trim side shoots back to 3-5 leaves.
- Prune blackcurrants - remove fruited stems.
- Cut back red/white currants by two-thirds.
- Cut summer raspberry canes to ground after fruiting, tie in new canes.
- Tidy strawberries: Remove straw, fertilise, prep new beds

### **General August jobs:**

- Pest patrol - Check brassicas for cabbage white eggs/caterpillars.
- Holiday planning: Ask a neighbour to water if you're away - Toppesfield community usually helps each other out.
- Order ahead: Garlic, onion sets, spring bulbs.
- Sow green manure on empty beds

### **Toppesfield - specific notes:**

Toppesfield Allotments often run community events - they had a successful boot sale in July last year. Worth checking the notice board for summer socials, tool shares, or if any-one's splitting seed orders. We will have a stand at the Church Fete on the 11th JULY.

Quick tips for Halstead weather: July/Aug can swing between heatwaves and wet weeks. Water deeply 2-3x per week rather than little daily sprinkles, and mulch after rain to lock moisture in.

We have a plot available if you are thinking of something to get involved!

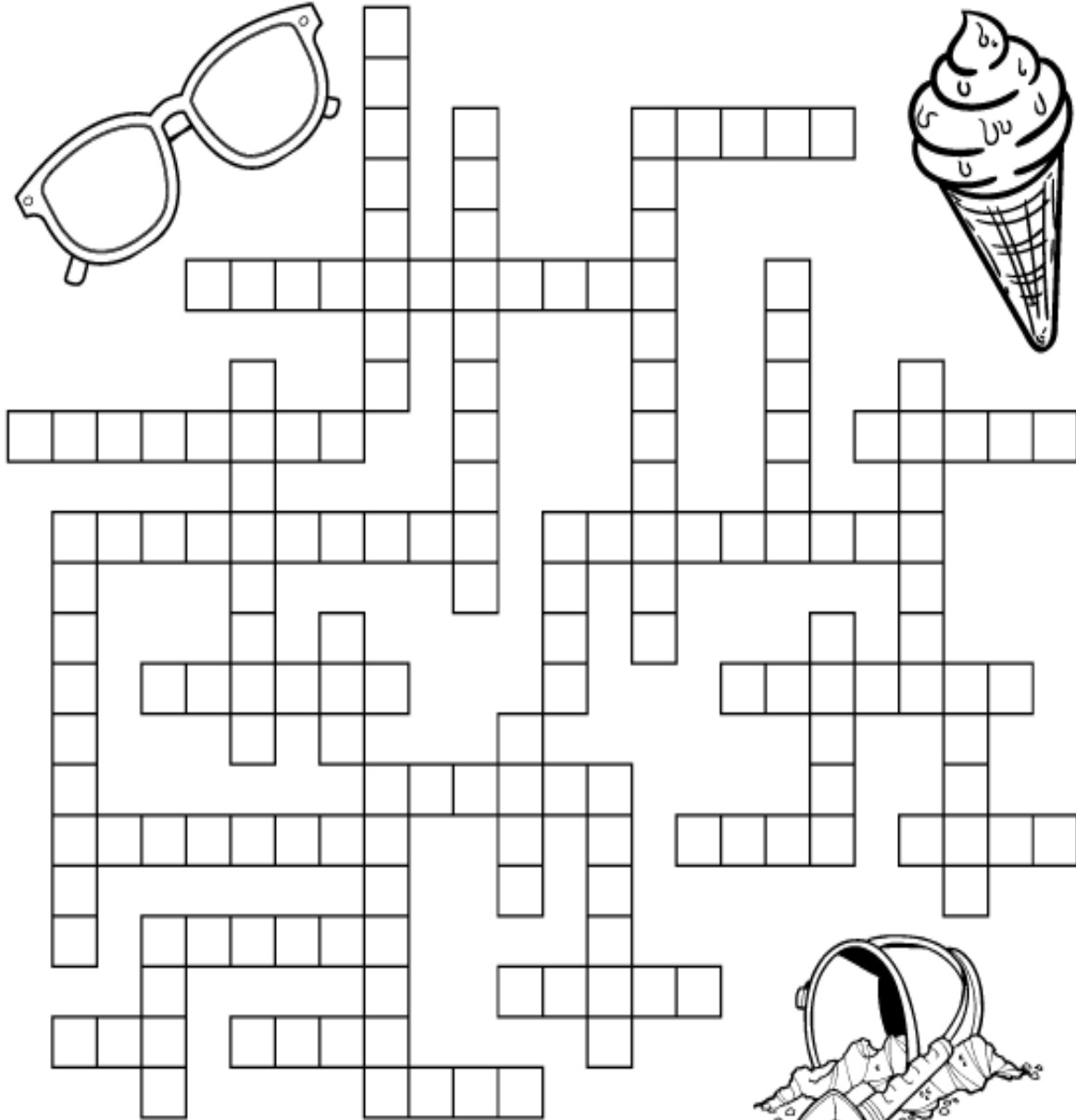
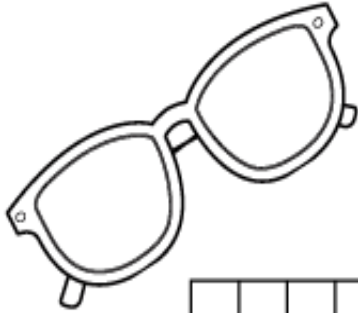
