#### **SUFFOLK POLICE URGENT MESSAGE**

Suffolk Police are urging residents to be vigilant after an elderly woman was targeted by telephone scammers. The incident was reported to Suffolk Police on **Tuesday 10 March**, by a bank in Bury St Edmunds, after a woman, aged in her 80s, from a nearby village, was persuaded to transfer a large sum of money by telephone scammers pretending to be from the fraud department.

The woman was also persuaded to withdraw some of the cash and it was later collected by a female courier.

**Courier fraud occurs when a fraudster contacts a victim by telephone and purports to be a police officer, bank or from a government department, among other agencies. A number of techniques will then be adopted in order to convince the victim to hand over their bank details or cash, which may then be passed on to a courier.**

Officers are urging residents not to hand over cash or cards to callers under similar circumstances. Scammers are known to make calls like this to convince people into handing over money, bank cards or personal information. **Suffolk Police are keen to hear from anyone who may have received a similar type of telephone call or have any information about this incident.
