Essex Police have employed Fraud Co-ordinators for each area of the county. North South and West. The Co-ordinators are responsible for arranging additional victim care to vulnerable victims of fraud and they are tasked by Officers through the Command and Control and Crime Recording Systems coupled with information received from the National Fraud Intelligence Bureau. In addition they work with a small team of Active Citizens who are volunteers that specialise in fraud. The Coordinators and the volunteers not only carry out victim visits but they will also take part in Community engagement events and Partner Events. If there is an event or a group meeting that you think would like this team to give a talk, input or advice to please contact your local Neighbourhood Watch Group and they will pass details via the Essex Watch Liaison Officers for the Co-Ordinator to make contact with you. More people in Essex are contacting independent charity Crimestoppers, which gives people the power to speak up 100% anonymously about crime, to keep communities safer.

From April to December last year, Essex people gave Crimestoppers nearly 6,500 reports about crime, an increase of 10 per cent over the previous year.
