

Considerable amount of work between MoD and BDC, including raising the possibility of the Airbase becoming a Garden Community, which the planning dept thought was OK.

2019

Feb: Homes England/MoD announces intention to build 4,850 houses on the Airbase.

3 weeks later the proposal is withdrawn

road network - medieval based – we still have hundreds of listed buildings in existence, not least of all next to the roads. 139 in Wethersfield, 152 in Finchingfield, 107 in Great Bardfield, 146 in Sible, 95 in Shalford.

pinch points can't be mitigated for at:

Sible (Hedingham Omnibus) and Rectory Lane, Great Bardfield bridge and layout Finchingfield (the 200 year old bridge due to be replaced like for like, single carriageway), the turn at the Guildhall, Wethersfield -Silver Street, which is blind to the primary school.

Mitigation comes by double yellow lines, speed bumps and traffic lights – that does not work at these pinch points.

Now, the leader of the council is always on about the difficulty with the roads as a possible show stopper.

He is not wrong in pure planning terms, but he forgets about the environment, the ecology, the air pollution, the mental well being of people, the reasons people live in the countryside, the fact that if you concrete over the countryside it is gone forever, for this generation and all generations to come.

Again, I do worry about the mindset at the top of the council when it has wanted to concrete over the Sailings for the West of Braintree Garden Community (13,000 houses) and now the initiation of this whole prisons proposal through the original response to the MoJ letter.





We are the body to get people engaged, to inform people to raise the community's concerns with those who make the decisions. Government bureaucracy tries to steamroller things through until people make themselves heard.

We want local people heard - that can have significant impact, at least to get those decision makers realising they have to think.

However, if this does get to a planning application then much more of the emphasis will go on the technical side run by WASC with its consultants. SWAP will need to be just as high profile, if not more so, to make sure the counter arguments against the assessments put forward by the MoJ's agents (which will be naturally biased) are heard properly.

One last thing to any councillors present. You do need to look at work being undertaken by WASC when available, WASC is preparing now because the volume of assessments, reviews, data that is going to come through on a proposal which could cost £700m+ is going to be huge and I don't believe you are going to be

able to handle it, in the depth it should be scrutinised, in the time that will be allowed. That's why WASC has been working with their consultants now, to get them prepared, otherwise it would be absolutely impossible to do so when or if an application arrives.
