- 1. Last meeting's notes to confirm and approve for publication (postponed) + matters and actions arising All please (re-)read and check that you are up-to-date with actions.
- 2. Updates: as needed
 - **KE News** MM reported that it was about to go out.
 - Canbury Community Garden Muddy Toddlers and school visits had continued/restarted. RBK were going to erect a new shed for the toddlers' toys; CCG/Muddy Toddlers had also received their funding from RBK for new equipment and a new hen coop. Seed and seedling planting was well under way.
 - RBK working groups continued with some TTK input MM had met with and been impressed by the RBK Transition to a Green Economy WG and the information provided to the group by council officer loanna Rossi. MM had attended on 11/4 to talk about The Kingston Hive project and to consult the business community about demand from green small business and start-ups a lot of business greening and useful info-sharing going on, including some kind of directory and a circular economy map work in progress at

- The Kingston Hive MM reported that the Hive Directors had got in their application to lease the community space in the former Post Office on Eden Street. It was a good application that fitted the criteria of St George (the developer), but there was competition for the space, and no indication of when the decision would be made. In the meantime, as the space would not be available till Feb 2023, a subgroup would continue looking for other space(s). There was considerable overlap between The Hive's aims and proposed activities and TTK's (e g film shows, talks, workshops etc).
