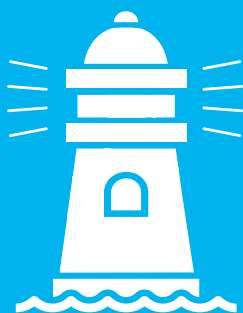

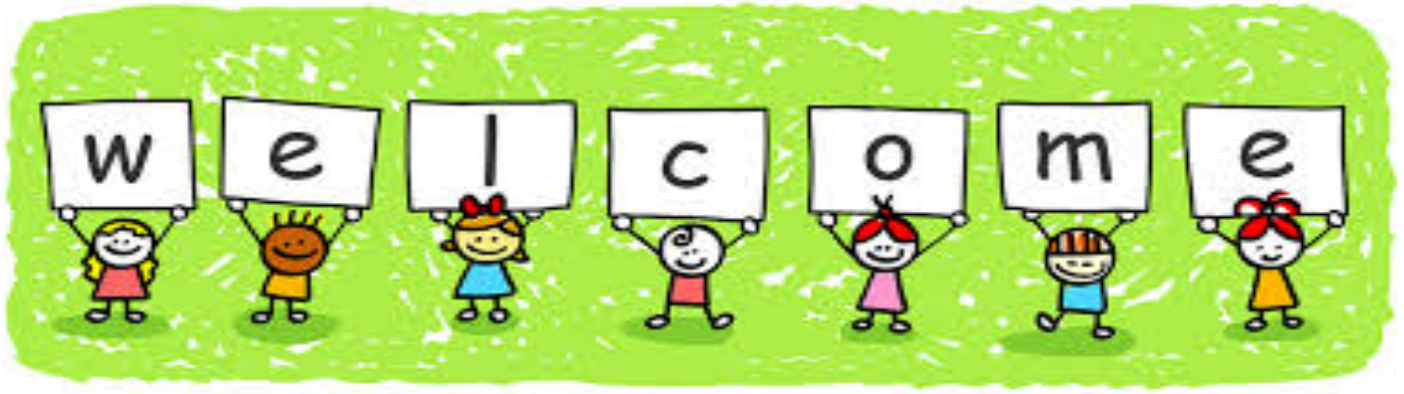

Hello, I am Jenny Bright and since 1976 I have lived in the heart of Thorpe Village. At that time we still had the village stores in Village Road and Mrs Rumbold, from Rosemary Lane, was still doing her good work for the church and community (she received Maundy Money from the Queen in recognition.)

Prior to that we were in Staines and used to come over to Thorpe Green as there was a small tennis club there at that time with a clubhouse.

Thorpe Neighbourhood Forum

Thorpe Neighbourhood Forum has met regularly to progress the policies we wish to see in the Neighbourhood Plan. A recent meeting was held in Thorpe Lakes where members also had a tour of the waterski and other exciting water sports on offer. This is a hidden gem for anyone interested in water sports and we were all amazed that we knew so little about our own area!

At the last three meetings we have had short presentations from developers who are hoping to build in the Thorpe Area.

Eden Retirement Living showed the Forum how they plan to develop Cemex House in Coldharbour Lane and this is now subject to a planning application for apartments for older people.

Simco Homes presented their ideas to develop the "Coltscroft" area at the bottom of Rosemary Lane with a mixed development of up to 80 units of accommodation. They are planning to have a public exhibition this autumn.

The Forum has also had two presentations from Cemex and Blackfield Land who have combined their ideas to develop the landfill sites between Coldharbour Lane and Green Lane. This 140 acre site would include 100 acres of parkland and public open space.

Again expect a public exhibition later this year on this proposal.

With recent changes to Planning law the Forum now has considerable say in how the "designated area" is developed and has listened to all who wish to talk to us about their plans. These developers have expressed an interest in working with the Forum to include the ideas you have given us at the Open Events and we see this as an exciting future for Thorpe.

We would always welcome new members to the Forum and if you have an interest in the development of the Neighbourhood Area then please contact one of the Thorpe Councillors for more details.

Local Ward Boundary Changes

Following the review started in November 2017 and completed earlier this year, the Local Government Boundary Commission for England (lgbce) has recently published its final recommendations for Runnymede Borough Council. This will effect Thorpe Ward, as well as all others in the borough.

The main change is that RBC will, from next May, have 41, rather than 42 local councillors. The new, smaller Englefield Green East Ward will be represented by 2, not 3 councillors. This follows many submissions received from Egham residents and organisations, including Runnymede Independent Residents' Group (RIRG) which your Thorpe Ward councillors are members of, concerned that the boundary changes proposed by RBC did not follow lgbce statutory criteria that natural boundaries and existing community identities should be taken into account. The Egham councillors, along with Thorpe's, are delighted and relieved that the lgbce has acknowledged and accepted their suggestions, keeping those in close proximity to the High Street in Egham ward, while areas nearer Staines Bridge will now remain in Egham Hythe ward.

Thorpe Ward will be losing the area north of Devil's Lane, the Vicarage Road area and Stroude Road north. It will gain the Penton Park area to the east of Chertsey Lane, and Laleham Reach. Further details will be included in the next two editions of Thorpe Together.

THORPE WAR MEMORIAL PROJECT

TWRA organised an all day charity event at Stuart Cottage, Thorpe on Sat 1st Sept which proved a huge success and raised the remainder of the money needed for the war memorial project.

The day featured live entertainment including Egham Brass Band and other brilliant live acts. Plenty of food and refreshments were provided by Five Pennies, with Beer, Pimms tent and BBQ run by The Gill family and friends. Also many different stalls included tombola, raffle, Egham Historical Society, Royal British Legion and children's crafts where they learned about the meaning of the poppy. Military memorabilia and vehicles were also on display. In the evening there was an Open Air Cinema attended by nearly 150 people. [see photos on the following page and back cover]

There is also a discussion about producing a booklet of those names remembered on the memorial and also covering recent fund raising events, such as Saturday's charity event and the proposed memorial re-dedication service on 4th November.

The total project cost was £14,000.00 and this has been raised with help from Runnymede Borough Council, Surrey County Council, Merlin, Five Pennies and many, many other kind benefactors. Our grateful thanks to all those who have contributed. You know who you are - who promised financial support and gave it!

You will notice that the memorial will now be removed temporarily for refurbishment work, preparation of the existing ground before the new granite plinth is inserted with the names of both military and civilian casualties from WW11. The existing memorial will then be returned and repositioned on the new granite plinth.

There will be a special re-dedication service on Sunday 4th November from 3pm at St. Marys Church, Thorpe with a candle procession to the memorial.

Once again our thanks to all who supported this project. Everyone involved felt it such a worthy cause!

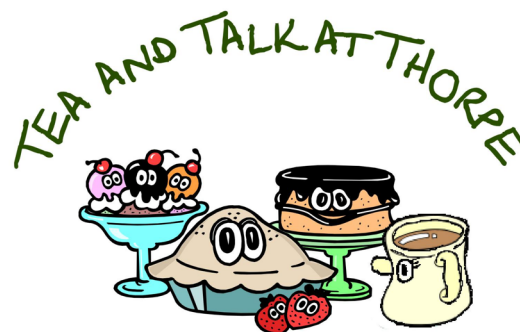

10th September: Gone to the Dogs - Greyhound Racing

Enjoy the excitement of a night at the Greyhound Stadium, as you watch recordings of six nail-biting races and use our 'funny money' to see if you can back a winner. In case you get on a losing run, you get the chance to win back some money by taking part in our special challenges.

24th September: Who was the original Jack the Ripper?

130 years since the first Whitechapel murders, this is still one of the most famous series of unsolved crimes in history. This session highlights how modern forensics has uncovered new evidence (such as hand writing analysis on the Dear Boss letters), new suspects (such as America's serial killer H. H. Holmes) and new theories (was Jack a foreigner and not the Englishman we have come to believe?). Come and hear popular speaker Karen Hanley and perhaps we will finally uncover England's biggest mystery.

8th October – How is the Church celebrating family life?

As an Anglican priest, with three step daughters, married to a deeply committed Roman Catholic, employed as a Parish Worker, our local curate, Gerard Mee may not have been deemed as the typical type of person who would have attended the World Meeting of Families. But having been given the gift of marriage and a readymade family by God, he simply wanted to learn how we can grow together as community. Hear from Gerard about his experiences and how the Church is celebrating family life.

22nd October : The History of Heathrow Airport – This chat is an introduction to the very beginning of Heathrow Airport, from 1909 when the first aircraft landed on Hounslow Heath. During the talk you will see from photographs and information the enormous changes that have occurred over the years from a comparatively small enterprise to a vast and complex industry that it is today! Our much-loved member Gio Corno makes his debut as a speaker sharing his knowledge of how Heathrow has grown from its humble beginnings.

12th November : Oh What a Lovely War (“Songs, a few battles and some jokes.”)

One day after the 100th anniversary of the end of 'the Great War', we will use the power of story, humour and song to commemorate this landmark. Later this month, Thorpe Players will be staging Joan Littlewood's iconic musical Oh What A Lovely War - the original 1963 production of which is reputed to have changed views on the war by counterpointing jaunty songs and hideous battle statistics. During this session, we will explore the story of how the show came to be and how it changed our view of WWI. You will also hear how it compares to the reality of some of the key battles and cast members will entertain you with excerpts from the show.

26th November – Chinese Mid-Autumn Festival

Celebrated in China and Vietnam, the 'Moon Festival' roughly equates to our own Harvest Festival and is the second biggest traditional Chinese holiday season after the Chinese New Year. In Hong Kong, you can watch the fire dragon and lion dances, enjoy festival food and drinks, find festival related sales and encounter crowds of shoppers and tourists on holiday.

Fresh from celebrating her own festival in Hong Kong, Tea and Talk member Kym will recreate the experience at Thorpe Village Hall. Along with lanterns, Chinese tea and samples of festival delicacy 'mooncake', Kym will introduce us to her proud traditions and even share a family fairy tale. Don't miss this opportunity to experience an authentic Chinese festival.

12th December: Apollo 8 and the 50th Anniversary of Man's First Visit to the Moon

Apollo 8 was launched from Cape Kennedy on 21st December 1968, the first of two rehearsals before Apollo 11 landed on the lunar surface in July 1969. Led by local historian Richard Williams and using postage stamps, philatelic material and photos, the talk will chart the rapid progress made in manned spaceflight by the Soviet Union and the United States of America in just 7 years.

A Message from the Revd Damian Miles, our Vicar.

As we enter the Autumn season, following such a hot summer, our thoughts turn to harvest and giving thanks for all that we have to eat and share. Harvest festivities have their origin in the worship of the Church and life of a rural community like Thorpe. Back in 1843 the first formal Harvest Festival Sunday took place, but before then Harvest was celebrated at the

beginning of August and was called **Lammas**, meaning '**Loaf Mass**'. Farmers made loaves of bread from the new wheat crop for their local church. These were then used as **Communion bread, in thanksgiving to God** for the harvest. This custom formally ended when Henry VIII broke away from the Roman Catholic Church, although at St Mary's we have our own Lammas loaf, on display every harvest. Giving thanks for all that we have, not least the food we enjoy, is very important and you are invited to St Mary's as part of this year's celebration on Sunday 7th October, 8, 10 or 11:30am, when we will remember those less fortunate than ourselves by collecting canned and other goods for Runnymede Foodbank and pasta for White Lodge. Also, this Autumn our Emmaus group will explore themes of thankfulness, forgiveness and love. Why don't you join in the journey? Wednesday evenings, 7:30pm. 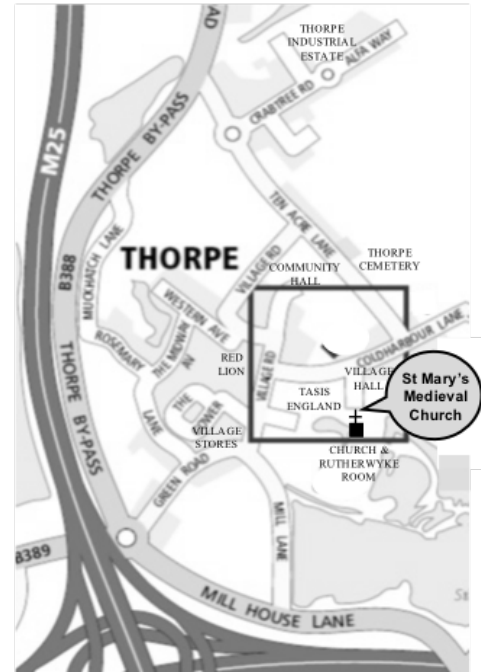
