



Trustees Update

We are delighted to announce that RBC's Community Services Committee has unanimously voted to offer us a lease for a further 15 years. The following is an excerpt of their comments from the meeting minutes:

"It was clear that everyone involved in running the hall had invested much time, effort and dedication to making the hall a lively and vibrant community-based facility, much loved and valued by its users. The Committee agreed there is much to be learned from their story and Members were also impressed with the physical improvements made to the building which had made it welcoming and inclusive while retaining its character as a grade II listed building of historic interest in the borough."

We are now negotiating the finer points of the lease to commence on 1st April 2019. When this is finalised, we will start to firm up our plans for the next few years, including funding to resolve the damp issues and refurbishments of the toilets, lighting and audio-visual equipment. We would like to thank everyone for their many letters in support of our application to renew the lease. I look forward to supporting this wonderful building and ensuring its future long beyond our 15 year lease.

12th March – Celebrating Spring: The Vernal Equinox on 20th March marks the beginning of Spring and is symbolic of rebirth, vitality, renewal, fertility, abundance and growth. With regular speaker, Sharon Young we will explore why it happens, what it means, how the date is decided and some of the traditions associated with it - such as egg laying rabbits, the rites of spring, spring cleaning, worshipping the sun serpent and celebrating the new 'Worm Moon'. We will talk about and might even try out a few customs from around the world such as egg balancing and painting, planting seeds, making / wearing shamrocks, throwing colours, drinking Dandelion and Burdock and basket weaving.

25th March - Florence Nightingale vs Mary Seacole: the first in our Epic Battles series. Both women, undoubtedly, changed the face of nursing and hygiene procedures in hospitals during the Crimean War. So how come Mary has been forgotten and Florence has become famous for these new procedures and medical successes? We uncover prejudice, racism and a life-long rivalry in a time when being a black woman meant being a second-class citizen – no matter how many people's lives you saved.

8th April - My Life at Heathrow Airport: following his debut talk about the history of Heathrow, our much-loved member Gio Corno returns with part 2 of his talk, which focusses on his own career at the British Airports Authority, who he joined as a Trolley Collector in 1971. On the anniversary of the first flight of Concorde, Gio will share how luck, curiosity and a willingness to accept responsibility saw him climb the career ladder

following the publication of a new book on its history, local historian Richard Williams will share some of its fascinating stories.

News Summary

Please find below a quick update on a range of subjects affecting our community:

- **Surrey CC consultation on closures, including Lyne Recycling Centre**: As you may know, SCC have decided NOT to close the recycling centre as part of their cost-cutting exercise which is good news. Thanks to all those that objected. We are aware of the pressures on SCC's budget and so would not be surprised to hear of future cuts.
- **Heathrow Southern Rail**: We continue to wait to hear an announcement from the Department for Transport as to which of the five rail options will be the preferred route. The Heathrow Southern Rail option would have the greatest impact on our Ward as it is expected that Chertsey would be the last stop before Heathrow and the route would broadly follow the M25 and then diverge towards Heathrow. An alternative is proposed from Virginia Water station to Heathrow. In response to a recent planning application in Thorpe, Heathrow Southern Rail confirmed the route that would follow the M25 through the Ward and it is expected that it would be 100ft underground just east of the Thorpe By-pass.
- Runnymede Borough Council Local Plan: TWRA made presentations to the Inspector currently examining the Local Plan. This followed a desktop study to gather evidence. We presented the case for Runnymede Borough Council ("RBC") to fully understand the cumulative impact of development in the functional floodplain and to therefore better monitor building activity in such a crucial area. I believe our representation was well received and it was agreed we would work with Runnymede Borough and Surrey County Councils on this matter. Further work is required by RBC, in particular the assessment of the A320 to understand the impact of the proposed housing allocation in the area and so it is unlikely the Local Plan will not be adopted until autumn 2019 (given more hearings and consultations will be required).
- **CEMEX House:** As reported previously, CEMEX business activities have now ceased at the Norlands Lane site and two planning applications have been submitted to convert CEMEX House into a residential care complex following the public exhibition on the proposals in March 2018. The proposals include conversion of the existing offices into retirement apartments along with the building of additional apartments on the existing office car park. At the February RBC Planning Committee, the councillors voted 8 to 7 to defer a decision, given representations by Merlin who operates Thorpe Park.
- **Thorpe Lea Road development:** Proposals for development of a new housing development for approximately 220 homes on land bounded by the M25, New Wickham Lane, Thorpe Lea Road and Clockhouse Lane East continue forward. This is one of the sites supported in the Local Plan mentioned above and is subject to the land being removed from the Green Belt.
- **Rosemary Lane development:** An outline planning application has now been received for this development involving up to 83 properties. TWRA have made objections to this application as currently the land is in the Green Belt but it is proposed that it be removed from the Green Belt as part of the new Local Plan. A decision will not therefore be made until after the Local Plan has been adopted.
- **Virginia Water Neighbourhood Plan:** Virginia Water has put forward a neighbourhood plan and as part of this proposed area has included Thorpe Green area up to the M25. TWRA have

- objected to this and suggested instead it should form part of an enlarged Thorpe Neighbourhood Area. A decision by RBC is expected by the time Thorpe Together is distributed.
- **Fly-tipping and littering:** TWRA are liaising over the fly-tipping and are looking to organise quarterly community collections. If you would like to help, please contact us via our website.
- **Egham and Thorpe Half Marathon**: A big thank you to those who have taken up the offer of free entry to the Marathon and who are helping raise money for TWRA.

For more than 40 years Thorpe has been served by Independent Councillors supported by the Residents' Association.
