A member of the public kindly attended the meeting to speak about the work of the Station Adopters. Thanks were expressed to the Parish Council for the new planters funded with \$106 money. They will be planted up by a local family and installed near a talking bench, a bench that people can sit on and listen to information about the local area, and which is also intended to be a safe space away from the railway line. Chappel and Wakes Colne Station Adopters is a local group of volunteers who work in partnership with Greater Anglia. Station adoption includes the involvement of the railway, the improvement of passenger experiences, social activities and the promotion of a healthy habitat for natural wildlife, especially bees. Greater Anglia's adoption scheme is the most successful with 126/133 stations adopted. Achievements of adopters at Chappel and Wakes Colne since 2020 include: the installation of eight platform-based self-watering planters, a three-tiered planter, two fence planters, a free-standing natural pond and a flower bed. A laburnum and beech tree, donated by Essex and South Suffolk Community Partnership, were planted to commemorate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. The Adopter's group has close partnerships with The East Anglian Railway Museum, Chappel and Wakes Colne Primary School, staff at The Platform2 Café and Wakes Colne Parish Council. They are very grateful to the Council for the planters, bulbs, flowers and noticeboard. Their aims for next year are to improve access to water, community events to involve families, possibly an insect hunt, bulb planting event, and another contribution to Open Gardens. Also, to find out the criteria to hopefully gain accreditation for a wildlife award.
