21/174	All Members	Welcome & Apologies for Absence.			
		The Chairwoman welcomed everyone. No apologies received.			
21/175	All Members	Declaration of Interests. Declarations of non-pecuniary indirect interests received from Cllr. Taylor			
		and Cllr. Fisher regarding item 21/179 Planning Matters Ref: 212722.			
21/176	All Members	mutual interest. Members of the public raised their objections regarding item 21/179 Ref: 212722.			
		This application is outside of the village envelope. They raised a range of detailed concerns about			
		highways matters, drainage, protected species living in the immediate and surrounding area, and so			
		on, as well as the past history of recent applications (in 2004 and 2014) for large-scale developmen			
		in the immediately adjacent vicinity to the north of the property to which the proposed access			
		route to one new property could potentially facilitate future development applications.			
21/177	All	Ward and County Councillors to address the members if present.			
	Members	Ward Cllr. Peter Chillingworth sent a report that was circulated to all Councillors prior to this			
		meeting. Flooding at the PO was discussed with respect to possible systems and financial support (see also			
		21/180 Item 2.). Cllr. Chillingworth has a locality budget of £2,000.00 which could be applied for;			
		closing date is January 2022. Cllr. Chillingworth to discuss with Chappel Parish Council at their			
		forthcoming meeting. The shop/post office is currently a community asset and as such could be			
		supported by the locality budget. Another meeting is to be arranged by Cllr. Chillingworth, with Cllr.			
		Taylor, Clir. Mead and Clir. Chamley from Chappel Parish Council to discuss how a flood relief			
		system can be progressed.			
		Cllr Chillingworth then proceeded to inform everyone about his planning application ref: 212717			
		and 212716. Ref: 212717 has been withdrawn as it was for a listed building; the house is a listed			
		building, but the outbuildings are not, so 21217 is not now required.			
		County Cllr. Lewis Barber reported that the proposed site meeting with the Portfolio holder from			
		ECC was cancelled at short notice and a new date is awaited. A speed survey is currently being			
		carried out on the A1124. Once the results are available it will be clear whether or not ECC will			
		support a VAS, but if the readings are not high enough then he will support a detailed proposal			
		from the Parish Council regarding permission for the location of a VAS which WCPC will purchase.			
		Cllr. Barber discussed the ECC budget and the amount of pressure on it for social care. Funding and			
		volunteers are available for public footpath clearance (to be discussed by a future footpath working			
		group meeting).

		Description: Outline Application for the Demolition of a Garage and the Erection of a Single				
		Dwelling with access driveway and car parking.				
		Location: Springfield, Station Road, Wakes Colne, Colchester CO6 2DS				
		After discussion, and taking into account residents' concerns, Objection				
		1. Wakes Colne Parish Council objects to the outline application because the proposed access				
		route, demolishing an existing garage, would lead to a site within the curtilage of Springfield				
		falls outside of the existing settlement boundary, consequently including the application site for the				
		development of a new dwelling. The application is effectively backland development on a				
		'greenfield' site (CBC Backland and Infill PPS3). Moreover, it meets none of the planning policy				
		requirements contained in either NPPF 2021 paragraph 80 for housing development outside of the				
		village settlement area or CBC ENV2 policy for rural communities.				
		2. We strongly request that the Planning Department pays serious attention to objections from				
		local residents submitted to its website and also to the fact that, unusually, 14 residents attended				
		the parish council meeting on 3.11.21 to voice their concerns. These are both germane to the				
		outline access proposal and even more so to any subsequent full proposal for a new dwelling. They				
		range over highways matters, drainage, protected species living in the immediate and surrounding				
		area, and the past history of recent applications (in 2004 and 2014) for large-scale development in				
		the immediately adjacent vicinity to the north of the property to which the proposed access route				
		to one new property could potentially facilitate future development applications. Thus, although this appears to be a simple outline application for a new access road to a new single dwelling in a				
		large garden, if granted there is the possibility, due to the direct professional connection of the				
		property owners with the adjacent landowner/property developer, to further, more extensive				
		applications.				
		<b>3.</b> We note that, curiously, the outline proposal includes two parking spaces for the currently				
		existing property Springfield but within the defined curtilage of the proposed new development,				
		which would retain all access rights to the private road giving onto Station Rd. This private road				
		(which appears to be jointly owned by Springfield and the erstwhile Halifax, recently renamed				
		White Lodge) constructed c. 1977, when the four properties to which it gives access were built, has				
		no pavement and is unsuitable for disability access. It suffers from continuous drainage issues				
		stemming from springs in the surrounding area, including the current garden of the appropriately				
		named Springfield. Moreover, the private road, in which two cars could not pass, abuts with a				
		restricted sightline onto Station Rd, which is known to ECC Highways as the subject of a 20-year				
		history of requests for traffic calming because it is a dangerous, narrow, high-banked road with				
		speeding vehicles, lacking public safety due to the absence of a footway for the length of the road				
		south of this junction until it meets with the A1124.				
		4. For these reasons Co. Cllr. Lewis Barber, who was present at the WCPC meeting, agreed to draw				
		this application for access to the particular attention of ECC Highways. Ward Cllr. Peter				
		Chillingworth, also present at the meeting, agreed to our request to call in this proposal to a full				
		Planning Committee meeting.

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		<b>Item 1.</b> Previous minute number 21/071 Greensward -the verge outside the Post Office, and The			
		Street. It was noted that, in carrying out works, Telec near the telephone book exchange and			
		Anglian Water on the corner of The Street have dug up some of the spring bulbs planted and not			
		made good the turf. The Clerk has contacted these agencies to arrange re-turfing or re-seeding the			
		areas but no clear information to date. Cllr. Barber was asked if he could look into these pieces of			
		land being transferred to the Parish Council by ECC as the Parish Council, who currently maintain			
		them, would then be better informed of utilities/services undertaking work across them.			
		Item 2. Previous minute number 21/074 Flooding near the Post Office - see item 21/177, para 1,			
		above. Research on various options had been undertaken by Cllr. Mead and information circulated			
		in advance to be considered by all Councillors. After discussion it was agreed that the recommended option was Fluvial Innovations, for 9 Ridged Plastic barriers at a cost of £1,854			
		VAT and delivery. Councillor Chillingworth indicated he would look favourably upon an application			
		to cover the purchase from the Locality budget. Cllr. Chillingworth to discuss barrier system,			
		storage, costs and ownership further with CPC and to arrange another working group meeting.			
		The Chairwoman asked Cllr. Barber if he could progress the application to the LHP for permission to			
		erect temporary signage when flooding likely. To be on the next agenda with update by Cllr Barber.			
		Proposed by Cllr. Mead, seconded by Cllr. Latarche; all in favour, resolution passed.			
		Item 3. Previous minute number 21/077 Neighbourhood Plan – a public meeting, with invited			
		speakers from CBC and Eight Ash Green, took place in the village hall on 13 <sup>th</sup> October at 7.30pm			
		advertised on our website, Facebook page and by leaflets. It was well attended by 41 members			
		the public, but since then only 1 volunteer from Wakes Colne has come forward and it is a			
		requirement that producing a Neighbourhood Plan is community led. Wakes Colne Parish Cou			
		are therefore not in a position to be able to go froward with this at this time due to lack of public			
		support. However, the matter can be revisited if the position should change.

		with the Community Rail Partnership, under ECC, which had initially recommended the lights and
