



Hello fellow gardeners. Here is our latest information update!

Spring at Last

“Oh, to be in England, now that April’s there,” wrote Robert Browning and in Wembury that line begins to make sense as the worst of the winter mud is behind us.

We had such a wet February that plot holders were behind their normal calendars but by April there are clear signs that the season has shifted and we’re back on track.

Overwintered broad beans are already in flower, their black and white blooms well established



with pollinators seeking them out. Garlic planted in the autumn stands strong, onions are steadily putting on growth, and rhubarb has responded well to the rain with firm, ready stems. Where the soil has drained sufficiently, early peas are going in, along with spinach and



hardy salads. The recent rain has also encouraged weeds, so there is no shortage of THAT work to be done. In the polytunnel, seedlings are gathering pace. Brassicas, leeks and the first tomatoes are being brought on carefully around the site Some plot holders are also growing extra plants ready for our **May Plant and Bake Sale on Saturday 9 May**, following the AGM on Thursday 7 May.
