MALDON DISTRICT COUNCIL COMMUNITY HUB GRANT SCHEME

"Voluntary, community and charity organisations in the Maldon District are invited to apply for a grant of up to \pm 1,000 to set up a new community hub or to support or provide more facilities at existing projects.

The new Community Hub Grant Scheme from Maldon District Council is being funded from a successful application to the Magnox Social Value Support Fund. Grants of up to £1,000 are available to assist organisations with schemes that support residents to keep warm and connect with the local community.

The grant could be used to help organisations:

- Increase the use of their space
- Start up a new activity
- Pay for utility bills or for energy efficiency measures
- Provide food and drink
- Activities for the elderly, children and families
- Activities that support the wellbeing of their local community

The first phase of applications will be considered on 7 April 2023. Applications received after that date will only be considered if the funding allocated to the programme has not been fully spent.

Criteria

Grants can be used to assist with new community hubs or support existing ones. This could include increasing the use of space, assisting with energy bills, provision of free warm food/drinks and providing new events or activities

• Applications that bring together partners to offer support for people in a respectful and practical way are welcomed

• Take up figures will be requested at the end of May 2023 for monitoring and evaluation purposes

£2 BUS FARE CAP TO BE EXTENDED



The government has announced plans to continue to cap single bus fares outside of London at £2 until the **end of June**, saving passengers money and encouraging more people back on the bus. Bus operators that are continuing the £2 fare cap scheme will be confirmed in due course.

The government's existing £60 million investment to cap single bus fares has already shown early signs of increased bus use.

Prime Minister Rishi Sunak said: "Getting more people onto reliable and affordable buses will strengthen communities and help grow the economy – connecting people to jobs, driving pensioners to see friends and family, and helping people attend medical appointments or access education."

AMBITIOUS ESSEX SUPPLY CHAIN CAMPAIGN

From Monday 13 March, you will need to book a slot to visit an Essex County Council recycling centre.

This is a trial that will be in place until December 2023. A booking system has already been trialled at Rayleigh Recycling Centre, and a booking system for large vehicles is currently in place at our nine van-friendly sites.

Both of these booking system trials have been successful in smoothing the pattern of demand across operating hours and reducing queues and congestion.
