MALDON DIVISION FEBRUARY UPDATE – COUNCILLOR JANE FLEMING

TRIAL OF BOOKING SYSTEM FOR ALL VEHICLES AT ESSEX WASTE RECYCLING CENTRES

This is an extension of the current pilot booking scheme running at the nine van friendly site for large vehicles and at the Rayleigh Recycling Centre, where all vehicle booking has been piloted. The pilot is being extended to all vehicles and all locations for 9 months from March 2023.

2 online booking systems running will run in parallel:

- o large vehicles with visit slots of 1 hour (vans, pick-ups, vehicles towing a trailer with more than one axle)
- o small vehicles with visit slots of 15 minutes

The number of visit slots is set at location level based on current demand and safe operating practice.

Best way to book is online, but the contact centre will offer telephone bookings for those who need it between 8:30am to 5:00pm, Monday to Friday. The contact number is **0345 743 0430**

The booking process is being extended to all sites to help manage waiting times, reduce congestion both in and around the sites, and improve the customer experience.

Both trials (Rayleigh and Large Vehicles) have been effective in smoothing the pattern of demand across operating hours and reducing queues/congestion.

A large amount of positive feedback from resident surveys carried out Autumn 2022 on how the booking process is working.

Blue badge holders and pedestrians do not need to book a slot.

The trial will be monitored and amendments can be made as necessary.

Any decision to retain a booking system in the longer term will be subject to further public engagement and decision.

No reports of increased fly-tipping offences across the county have been received since the introduction of the booking process for Large Vehicles and at Rayleigh.

WHAT WILL THE £2 BUS PRICE CAP MEAN FOR YOU?



The new bus price cap scheme came into effect on 1 January 2023 and aims to take at least 2 million car journeys off the roads in England, cutting congestion and pollution for everyone.

With the average single fare for a 3 mile journey estimated at over £2.80, the new fare which takes place until 31 March 2023, will save passengers almost 30% off the price.

- Country parks Relax with a book and then enjoy a walk around one of Essex's parks (First Buses S1 or S2 Wivenhoe or Stanway to Highwoods Country Park).

- Visit another county Take a trip to Cambridge from Saffron Walden (Stagecoach 7). What sightseeing would you do first?
- Essex cities Travel between two cities (Chelmsford and Colchester).
- Travel into London Catch First Buses 351 to Shenfield where you can take the new Elizabeth Line into London.

ARMY AND NAVY SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORT PACKAGE



Essex County Council are continuing to progress the <u>Army and Navy Sustainable Transport Package</u> as quickly as possible and are working hard to achieve the best solution for Chelmsford.

In October 2022, Essex County Council submitted an Outline Business Case to the Department for Transport (DfT) for the proposed package – the next stage

of the bidding process for Major Road Network (MRN) funding to build the scheme.

If the Outline Business Case is approved, the next step will be to work towards submission of planning applications for the different elements of the package.

As well as the expansion of Chelmer Valley Park and Ride, the proposed Army and Navy Sustainable Transport Package includes a new hamburger roundabout layout (a new roundabout with a road through the centre of it) at the Army and Navy junction. It also includes improved sustainable and active travel provision, with bus priority measures and walking and cycling improvements at the junction itself and on the approaches to and from the roundabout, and a 350-space expansion of Sandon Park and Ride.

Based on the current programme, planning applications are expected to be submitted in the summer. Construction of the package will be phased and is scheduled to start in Spring 2025 and be completed in early 2028.

RAILWAY STRIKES - CAN YOU GET A FULL REFUND IF YOUR TRAIN JOURNEY IS CANCELLED?

The answer is usually that yes you are entitled to a full refund if your journey is cancelled completely.

If you're delayed and arrive at your destination more than half an hour late, you'll usually be able to get some money back. Some train companies will also give you compensation if your train is more than 15 minutes late. It's recommended that you keep your train tickets to prove purchase and to get a refund.

If possible you should try to claim within 28 days of the planned journey, but some train companies allow longer.

Train operators have details of how to claim on their websites and you are usually able to start a claim with them via that route. If you have purchased a season ticket, it's recommended that you ask at your local ticket office or check your train company's website and you will usually be able to get some money back for a delay or cancellation.

POSTAL STRIKES - WHAT CAN YOU DO IF YOUR POST IS DELAYED OR LOST?

You might be able to claim compensation from Royal Mail. The level of compensation awarded will be dependent on how the item was sent and what the item is. If you bought something online, over the phone or in a shop you should try to contact the seller before you ask Royal Mail for compensation.

You can usually:

- ask for a refund or redelivery if the item didn't arrive
- check your options for returning damaged or broken goods

RECYCLING OF VAPES

Did you know 3 million vapes are thrown away every week in the UK? Vape kits (both disposable and rechargeable) contain batteries and precious metals. These can be a fire hazard if discarded in the bin, and the resources lost for good if they're not recycled properly.

If you, or someone you know, has switched to vapes this new year, make sure you know how to recycle them. You can take them to any <u>Essex recycling centre</u>, or use local small electrical recycling points.
