The Saltmarsh Coast Walking Festival is a 10-day festival, designed to help you celebrate and enjoy the Maldon District's rich tapestry of history and heritage along its 75 miles of coastline.

### GOVERNMENT EXTENDS £2 SINGLE BUS FARE

Travelling by bus continues to be affordable with single fare tickets costing just £2 allowing passengers to travel across Essex. All you need to do is ask your bus driver for a single ticket then sit back and enjoy your bus journey. Before you travel make sure to check your route is eligible for the £2 single fare on the [Government website](#). The **£2 rate will run to 31 October 2023**.

The capped single fare will then be extended for at least another year at **£2.50 until 30 November 2024** – when the government will review their effectiveness and future bus fares.


The training is funded by the council's Nightingale Care Bursary and run by the council's adult education service, ACL Essex.

## FORD RIDE LONDON-ESSEX SET TO RETURN FOR THREE YEARS

Following its success in 2023, [Ford RideLondon-Essex](#), one of the world's greatest cycling events, is returning to Essex for another three years (2024-2026).

We reached a three-year agreement with the organisers London Marathon Events, to host the event again until 2026. The agreement includes the Ford RideLondon-Essex mass participation events and two stages of the Ford RideLondon Classique.

## NEW £7.5 MILLION GRANT PROGRAMME TO SUPPORT RESIDENT'S HEALTH

ECC have announced a new £7.5 million grant programme. The Public Health Accelerator Bids (PHAB) programme will launch later this year, supporting projects designed to improve residents' health and tackle health inequalities.

There are two levels of grant - small grants under £15,000 and major grants over £15,000. Grants are available to voluntary organisations, charities, schools, councils and more.

## VIOLENCE AND VULNERABILITY COMMUNITY GRANT LAUNCHES

The 2024 to 2025 [Violence and Vulnerability Community Grant](#) is now open. The grant is open for local 'not-for-profit' voluntary or community clubs or organisations based in Essex, Southend and Thurrock.

## TAX-FREE CHILDCARE FOR WORKING FAMILIES

[Tax-free childcare is a government scheme](#) to help working families save on their childcare costs.

Eligible working parents and carers can get up to £500 every three months (up to £2,000 a year per child). If your child has a disability, you can get up to £1,000 every three months (up to £4,000 a year per child). You can use it to pay for approved registered childcare including:

- childminders
- nurseries and pre-schools
- holiday play schemes
- before and after school clubs
