UPDATE ON THE 99A BUS SERVICE - NOW THE 99 SERVICE

Following Travel Essex's post on 26 July 2024 "Bus services operated by Arrow Taxi's and Essex and Suffolk DaRT | Travel Essex", Passenger Transport have shared the following update.

The following service will run initially for 3 months as follows:

Service 99A Maldon – Broomfield Hospital – Will be operated by Stephensons of Essex commencing 28 August 2024. The service will be renumbered the 99. There is also a revised timetable and route.

CONSULTATION ON WALKING & CYCLING NETWORKS IN ESSEX

A new survey asking residents' opinions on networks in Buckhurst Hill, Chigwell, Loughton, Harwich and Dovercourt, Maldon, Clacton and Jaywick and Waltham Abbey has been launched.

Residents and businesses are being encouraged to give their views on local walking and cycling networks in their area.

The findings will help the council develop and plan routes over the next ten years, helping to increase the travel options available to members of the public.

The survey focuses on the areas of:

- Buckhurst Hill, Chigwell and Loughton
- Harwich and Dovercourt
- Maldon
- Clacton and Jaywick
- Waltham Abbey

Residents are being asked whether the routes provide the right local links. They are also being asked whether there are any routes that should be extended to reach specific destinations.

The consultation will run until Sunday 13 October.

Called Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plans (LCWIPs), these networks are designed to create coherent cycling and walking routes. They are an important step for Essex to achieve the vision of a safer, greener, and healthier county.

LCWIPs ensure that a long-term approach is taken to targeting investment in the right places. They also form a vital part of the Government's strategy to increase sustainable trips.

Only views on the overarching network of routes are being sought at this stage, not on specific infrastructure. To take part in the survey,

PROPERTY FLOOD RESILIENCE GRANT

Check your flood risk and see if you are eligible for the Property Flood Resilience (PFR) grant. You can also submit your questions about surface water flooding and the impact of flooding. COMMUNITY ENERGY GROUPS

Since the first group was launched in 2020, Essex is now home to 21 community energy groups and this number is rapidly expanding.

As part of continuing the conversation around community energy, Essex County Council hosted a Community Energy in Essex webinar on Monday 29 July. During the event, attendees were able to learn more about community energy, how it can benefit our communities and hear from two well established groups including Community Energy South and Community Energy Colchester.

Last year, the Council won the <u>'Supportive Local Authority' category</u> at the 2023 Community Energy Awards in recognition of its demonstrated exceptional support and commitment to the

community energy sector. Working closely with communities to find innovative solutions to transition to clean energy continues to be a key priority of Essex County Council's Climate Action Plan.

RIGID PLASTIC RECYCLING SCHEME

The <u>rigid plastic recycling scheme</u> is currently in place at the following recycling centres: Braintree, Brentwood, Clacton, Chigwell, Colchester, Harlow, Saffron Walden and Witham. It will soon be available at Burnham-on-Crouch, Rayleigh and another site to be announced shortly.

A wide range of items that cannot be recycled at the kerbside are accepted. This includes plastic buckets, storage boxes, garden furniture, toys and plastic plant pots.

Previously, rigid plastic items were being sent to landfill. This initiative is a great opportunity to recycle rigid plastic items that are no longer needed and that cannot be reused.

Since the start of the scheme in May 2024, over 64 tonnes of plastics have been sent for recycling. This is the equivalent of roughly 5 double decker buses!

ESSEX WASTE PARTNERSHIP

On 23 July, Essex County Council adopted the <u>Essex Waste Partnership's</u> new Waste Strategy for Essex! This is the second authority to adopt the strategy following Uttlesford Council's decision earlier in the month.

The waste strategy sets out the partnership's plan for how to manage recycling and waste in the county for the next 30 years.

The vision of the strategy is simple: We are rethinking our waste – by everyone working together, we will reduce, reuse and recycle more. This will protect the environment and save resources.

The other 11 councils in the partnership will be taking decisions on whether to adopt the strategy over the next couple of months.
