Since March 2023, residents have had to book to visit Essex County Council recycling centres. Following an evaluation of the trial, we are now proposing to keep the booking process permanently.

ECC CONDITIONALLY AWARDED £69M FOR ARMY AND NAVY TRANSPORT PACKAGE

Plans to transform the Army and Navy junction in Chelmsford and improve sustainable travel options in the city have taken a huge step forward after Essex County Council was conditionally awarded £69million of Government funding.

The proposed <u>Army and Navy Sustainable Transport Package</u> includes a hamburger roundabout (a new roundabout with a road through the centre of it) at the Army and Navy junction in Chelmsford, bus priority measures and walking and cycling improvements at the junction itself and on the approaches to and from the roundabout. The package also includes a 350-space expansion of Sandon Park and Ride, and a 500-space expansion of Chelmer Valley Park and Ride.

Having worked closely with partners and the local community to develop the proposed package of improvements, the council submitted an outline business case for the project in October 2022.

The £81million project, which will also be part funded by Essex County Council and Chelmsford City Council, can now move forward after the Department for Transport approved the outline business case and agreed to contribute £68.75million of Major Road Network (MRN) funding, subject to certain conditions.

The funding is dependent on planning consent and other processes, as well as a full business case. It will enable designs to be finalised and fund the construction of all elements of the package.

HIGHWAYS - NEW WAY OF FIXING POT HOLES

A new, quicker way to fix potholes has been trialled in Colchester and Tendring. The method uses recycled materials and involves pouring the material straight into the pothole rather than digging up the road.

The results will be monitored over the winter, before Essex Highways decides whether to roll it out across the county. Find out more about the <u>recycling approach to fixing potholes</u>.

TAKE ACTION TO PREVENT FLOODING

Landowners are being urged to clear any ditches and trim back trees and hedges to help prevent flooding over the autumn and winter months. Essex Highways has been maintaining the land it

owns in preparation.

Legally private landowners, including farmers, property developers and homeowners have a duty to keep on top of vegetation near roads and pavements.

Tips to prevent flooding

We've provided five actions you can take to prepare for and reduce the impact of flooding:

- 1. Install (and empty) a <u>water butt</u> to capture rainfall from your roof.
- 2. Minimize use of materials, like tarmac, in your front garden that rain cannot soak into.
- 3. Plant trees and shrubs to improve water absorption and create a <u>rain garden</u> to allow water to slowly soak into the soil
