### 2. Wandsworth Older People's Network – Update

The Network actively represents older people's interests in Wandsworth and responds to policy and service consultations as well as coordinates information sharing among organisations and individuals in Wandsworth. Its core aims are to provide a voice for older people and to eliminate poverty, isolation and loneliness. Contact: Lilias Gillies

At the Network's conference in November 2009, Lifelong Learning opportunities were discussed with a range of speakers. The conclusion was that there are some opportunities available, such as Active Days and U3A organised by Age Concern, but that fees are high and that most initiatives are aimed at people needing to skill up for employability purposes.

The group has been working closely with Adult Social Services both on the formulation and monitoring of the Older People's Strategy. The latest in a series of events was the conference that took place on 11 March to look at progress to date. ### 3. Sustainable Community Strategy – Thematic Updates

### Making Wandsworth Safer

The Annual Strategic Review and Assessment of Crime and Disorder provides an analysis of changes in patterns and trends of crime and disorder in Wandsworth and every year.

The assessment shows crime hotspots in the borough and breaks down when and where different types of crimes are committed. It also profiles the offenders and the victims.

The assessment is carried out through partnership working between the Council and the Police and the result is a Partnership Plan for Crime and Disorder Reduction in Wandsworth. The Plan is reviewed annually and the for 2009-2012 are:

- 1. Serious Violent Crime
- 2. Serious Acquisitive Crime
- 3. Drugs

- 4. Young People and Crime
- 5. Community Reassurance
